EXPECT DECISION IN WHITNEY CASE

Verdict of Court in Breach of Promise Suit Is Looked For Soon.

CHARGES ARE DENIED

Millionaire Denies That He Is Father of Child of Evan Burrows Fontaine, Former Follies Girl.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 27.—(United Press.)—The federal district court here expects soon to hand down a decision in the case of Ivan Burrows Fontaine, former Zeigfeld Follies girl, who is suing Cornelius Vanderbilt Whitney for \$1,000,000 alleging breach of promise.

Whitney in his answer denied ever having illicit relations with Miss Fontaine, and entered a general denial of all other allegations contained in her suit. He asks dismissal of the suit and issuance of a writ of injunction preventing further prosecution.

The answer also charges Miss Fontaine with attempting to extort money from Whitney. The dancer invited him into her room at a hotel in New Haven, Conn., and with her parents present accused him of being the father of the child she was expecting, demanding that he marry her. Whitney refused. Whitney also charges Miss Fontaine with being a married woman during the period of their acquaintance, stating that she served her husband, Sterling L. Adair, with a fictitious divorce action in Savannah, Ga., and in July, 1920, upon false testimony obtained a decree of divorce against him in Rockwell, N. Y.
