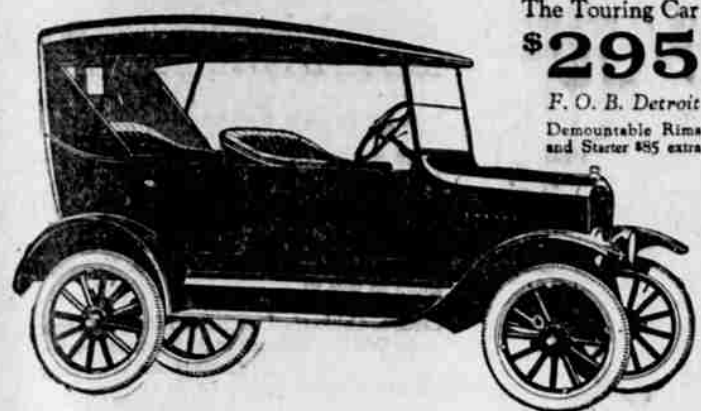

PLAY FAIR DRIVING ON THE HIGHWAYS

"Hey," yelled the motorist to the pedestrian whom he had just knocked down and run over, "take a look at my brakes and see if they're dragging, will you?"

Somewhat overdrawn possibly, but any pedestrian will tell you that he wouldn't put it above an automobile driver to do such a thing. And the motorist, himself, would say: "Why don't those birds watch their step; do they think that we are mind readers?" Right here is the whole situation—lack of courtesy.

As To Pedestrians

Does the pedestrian thank the motorist who throws on his brakes and allows him to cross safely from the curb and catch a trolley that is to get him to the train? Yes, we have no bananas! Does the automobile driver wave acknowledgement to the pedestrian who goes out of the way to make things easier when the car driver is trying to steer through a congested street. No, he does not! Consequently both driver and pedestrian would aid them to shield the public from preventable traffic accidents.

per cent on outstanding stock and increased the capital stock from \$25,000 to \$100,000. The firm operates auto stages between Coos Bay and Roseburg, and an extra line from Coos Bay to Myrtle Point and Coquille and through Curry county from Coos Bay to Brookings. The stock dividend distribution was made in the form of new stock. The firm has sufficient funds to recapitalize and make the improvements and additions without calling for further stock subscriptions.

AUTO CLUB TO GIVE FREE LEGAL ADVICE

PORTLAND, July 1.—Establishment of a legal branch by the Oregon State Motor association, as an additional aid to the motorists affiliated with the organization, will be undertaken immediately, according to the announcement made last week by George Brandenburg, manager of the association.

The step was approved at a directors' meeting and Meyer C. Rubin, local attorney, engaged to handle the work.

The program is to offer to the motorist in the club free legal advice on all subjects touching the automobile field, varying from legal advice in questions of accident to contracts for car purchase, and the issuance of resumes of the latest laws and regulations.

Establishment of local legal counsel under the plan at all branch offices of the association throughout the state is also included.

Law To Be Upheld

It is pointed out that the automobile association, while it will aim to protect in so far as possible the legal rights of its members, does not plan to constitute itself a refuge for law violators. "We want to see the law fully obeyed," explained Mr. Brandenburg, "but we also desire to keep our members from having unnecessary trouble with legal entanglements of either criminal or civil court nature."

The service, explains the manager, is one of the things listed on the enlargement and expansion program of the organization. Steps are being taken for the launching in the near future of a drive to raise the membership of the Portland organization through the acquisition of 1000 new members.

New Branches Planned

Recently officials of the club took the preliminary steps for the formulation of a branch of the club in Roseburg, for Douglas and Coos counties and one in Eugene for Lane county.

"A wide field of activity for the association is at present covered but increased membership will make still further aid possible," said Mr. Brandenburg. "We cannot hope to get the best out of the organization for the motorists of Portland and the state without united support and co-operation."

The touring information which the association has been giving, it is pointed out, has met with wide-spread approval, and through the American Automobile association, in co-operation with similar state clubs, is able to furnish the motorist very comprehensive information.

NEW GAS IS NOW ON MARKET

Nation-wide distribution of ethyl gas, the new product designed to give economy to automobile operation, soon will be accomplished by the General Motors Chemical company, according to T. E. Doremus, Pacific Northwest manager for E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Co., Inc., which concern developed the gas and has now turned over the manufacture of it to the General Motors Chemical company.

Mr. Doremus has just been advised that the second unit of the plant for manufacture of ethyl gas has been completed by the du Pont engineers and turned over to the operation department. "This means," Mr. Doremus said, "the General Motors soon will be in a position to give national distribution to the new gas. It will be several months," Mr. Doremus said, "before ethyl gas will be obtainable on the Pacific Coast, owing to the enormous demand that has developed in the east for it."

It is declared that the ethyl fluid will not only benefit present day automobiles but will open the way for construction of high compression engines capable of operating on low gasoline consumption.

The manufacture and distribution of ethyl gas is somewhat unique and is an affiliation of the largest concerns in three separate lines. The basic material is produced by the du Pont companies; the ethyl fluid itself is manufactured by the General Motors Chemical company, a division of General Motors corporation; the ethylizers which mix the fluid with gasoline at gasoline service stations are made by the Dayton Engineering Laboratories, another General Motors unit.

Distribution of ethyl gas is in the hands of the present oil companies of the country. At present the Standard Oil company of New Jersey, the Standard Oil company of Indiana, Gulf Refining company, Sinclair Refining company and the Refiners Oil company are distributing ethyl gas in

some sections of their territory.

Ethyl gas is said to cause a more even explosion, thus eliminating the harmful "knock" when a car is quickly accelerated or when laboring up a hill. The use of ethyl gas it is declared, will make possible the operation of engines with even higher compression than those which have been used in the last few years in racing cars. With higher compression, a much smaller engine will develop greater horsepower and will consume less gasoline.

Reckless driving is defined as driving and operating a motor vehicle so as to create a hazard to life, limb or property. This covers wide range, from the operation of a car with defective brakes or glaring

head lamps to cutting across traffic without a warning to cars in the rear, and includes any act or omission calculated to jeopardize the lives or property of others. The motor patrol will be particularly watchful for reckless drivers.

FORD CARS PRESENT STAGGERING ARRAY

DETROIT, Michigan, July 1.—Selection of the Lincoln Highway as the official route of travel for Ford Car No. 10,000,000 on its trip from New York to San Francisco brings the world's most popular road and the world's most popular car into a new and more intimate association.

RANDON PASSES AUTO LAW

MARSHFIELD, Or., June 28.—The city of Randon has found it necessary to pass an automobile ordinance and special attention is given to parking arrangements.
