nant are they over the matter that they have decided to take Mr. Mauerer before the state board of control and ask for an investigation of conditions at the Oregon Soldiers Home. "We are getting tired of begging and pleading for our men to be admitted to the home for care," said one of the vets this morning. "The government pays the home \$120 per head per year to care for them and we are going to see that they get that care. This man is a wreck. He needs medical attention and to have him cast out of a state institution is a rank insult to the veterans of all wars. We have already made an investigation and from questioning at the home from hospital attendants we find that Mr. Mauerer was an ideal patient. He did not cause them one bit of trouble and there is plenty of room over in the hospital right now for him. It is time for a showdown and we are going to demand it. These boys are entitled to better treatment and our organization will leave no stone unturned to see that they get it." Plans are on foot to take Mr. Mauerer to Salem at once where the governor and members of the board of control will be notified of local conditions.

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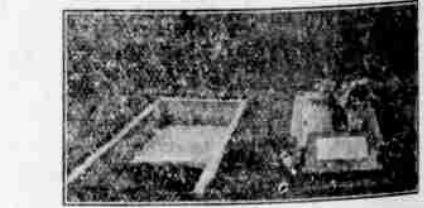
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
