EVANGELIST TELLS ABOUT MILLENNIUM

"The millennium, and the false hope of a second chance," was the subject of the lecture by Evangelist T. L. Thumler at the tent on North Rose street last night. The speaker declared that the doctrine of a second chance for salvation was without foundation in the Bible. He based his remarks on various verses in Revelation 20, and said that "the millennium was a period of 1000 years bound by two resurrections. One at the beginning, the resurrection of the righteous at the second coming of Christ; the other at the close of the 1000 years, that of the wicked."

The evangelist said that "between the two resurrections—the 1000 year period—the righteous are in heaven and the wicked are dead." He said, "that the bottomless pit mentioned in Revelation 20 was the earth in a chaotic condition, the place that Satan is cast into by the decree of God and the chain of circumstances, and he abides there for a thousand years. The righteous are all in heaven; the wicked have not been raised; the wicked living at the coming of the Lord have been consumed, and Satan bound by circumstances, over which he has no control, views for a thousand years the great destruction wrought by sin."

"At the end of the thousand years," the speaker declared, "the wicked will be raised from the dead." Then the chain of circumstances that bound Satan would be loosed, and as men lived again on earth he would go out and again begin the work of deception. The evangelist read from Rev. 20, how Satan would so control the hosts of the wicked under his power of deception "that they will think themselves able to lay siege to the city of God, and at that time fire would come down from God out of heaven and the wicked would be consumed." The speaker referred to the prophecy of Peter pointing to this same time, 2 Pet. 3:13.

Evangelist Thumler alleged that the "matter of a second probation is a false hope, lulling men to sleep in carnal security at the very time when eternal issues are at stake in their own experiences, and that 'now is the accepted time; now is the day of salvation.' Urging his hearers to make that preparation of heart and life that would fit them to stand with God and the saved when Jesus comes."

The subject tonight is "The Home of the saved—Where is it and What is it." Mrs. Wood will sing at this service.

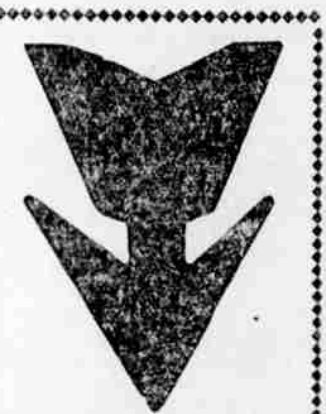
