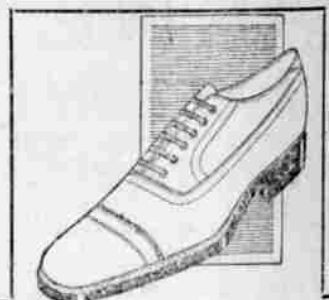
MEDFORD, Ore., July 18.—Forest service officials are greatly worried over a large fire which recently started in the Willows creek district five miles east of Butte Falls in log-
