BOZEMAN, Mon., July 18.—Although farmers suffer first and apparently the most a fall in prices from post-war inflationary indications now point to a slowing up in all lines of business and a consequent return of the farmers' dollar to its full buying power. TOWN IS ENDANGERED BY HUGE FOREST FIRE

DUNSMUIR, Calif., July 18.—A forest fire in a new section of the Siskiyou region which broke out late yesterday, was early today, endangering the town of McCloud, in northern California, according to reports received here. Calls for all available volunteer fire fighters were sent to Weed and other neighboring towns. The blaze is reported to be raging unchecked in heavy timber.

Another fire which broke out at the same time on the Siskiyou-Shasta county boundary in a forest east of Nut Glade and about a mile from Dunsmuir was reported burning uncontrolled this morning. Fire-fighting forces were being organized among citizens, tourists and campers.
