BUENOS AIRES, July 19.—A midnight bulletin issued by the Rio Janeiro government of the state of insurrection as received by La Nación states:

"Preparations are almost complete for executing a federal maneuver against the Sao Paulo government. Dense fog during the last 12 hours has hindered the necessary reconnoitering, but the situation is favorable."

"President Bernardes who continues to receive manifestations of support from all parts of the country has issued a decree extending the moratorium in the state of Sao Paulo until July 27 is found."
