DEALERS EXPECT TO SELL MORE DODGES

Two cartons of cars have been ordered by J. O. Newland & Son, local Dodge Brothers dealers, which will arrive in Roseburg the latter part of July and the early part of August. August, September, and October are good months in which to sell cars, according to their past records. This normal condition is expected to be stimulated by the generally improved business conditions.

"We look for a bigger volume of business this fall than we have ever had because of the many improvements made by changing our buildings," said J. O. Newland, "therefore, we are preparing to meet the greater demand."

"The factory is building more cars than ever before in its history and we are no longer seriously handicapped by lack of cars to sell. Dodge Brothers' policy of constantly improving their car without making yearly model changes prevents the Dodge car buyers from waiting at this time of year."

Since the slump of June the local dealers have sold the cars they had with the exception of one Graham Brothers truck and one 4-passenger coupe. They are now taking orders for cars to be delivered out of the coming cartons.

Dodge car sales during the next three months will run approximately the same as in the early year months of March, April and May, according to the records of J. O. Newland & Son. Based on their graph showing the total number of cars sold during the different months of the year, the peak usually comes in June and July. Due to unusual conditions this year, however, the peak is expected in their business this fall be-

fore dropping to the ordinarily slow period of sales in November.

CAMPAIGN WORK TO FALL TO WHEELER

(Associated Press Licensed Wire.) WASHINGTON, July 23.—The brunt of active campaigning for the La Follette ticket probably will fall on Senator Wheeler of Montana, the vice-presidential candidate. He expects to take the stump late in August in Boston and from then on to conduct a speech-making campaign of growing intensity.

Formation of definite campaign plans await the selection of the committee which will direct all phases of the fight for votes. To what extent Senator La Follette and his running mate should make a personal appeal for support has been the subject of discussion at informal conferences.

The tentative plan, which the campaign committee is expected to approve and chart in more definite form, calls for Senator Wheeler to lead off the fight. He leaves tomorrow for a three week's rest at a Cape Cod resort and probably will return to Washington for further conferences with Senator La Follette before delivering his first speech in Massachusetts his native state.

Later the Montana senator will swing westward through industrial states of the east and middle west to the Pacific coast. Before election day he expects to invade a number of states in the west and southwest and one or two in the south.

ELKS WILL DANCE ON ISLAND THURSDAY

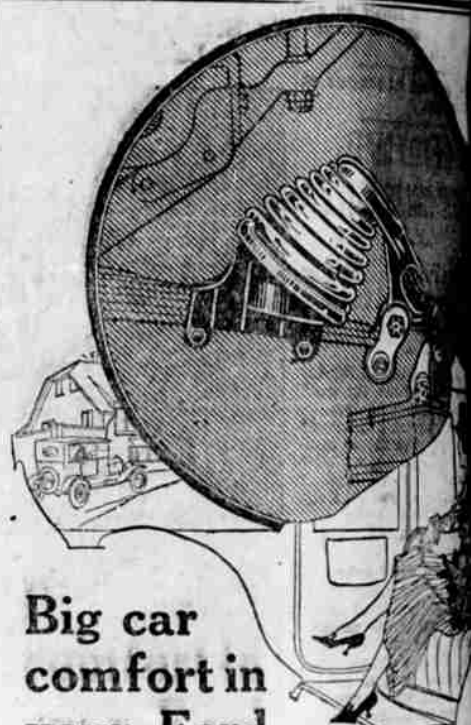
