MAY RECOGNIZE SOVIET RUSSIA

Japanese Cabinet Adopts Policy Looking to Full Recognition.

MEANS CONCESSIONS

Jap Press Declares Move Means Big Change in Standing of Countries—Must Apologize.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) TOKYO, July 24.—A new policy toward Russia on which it is believed the government would be willing to grant recognition to the Soviet government, was adopted by the cabinet at an extra ordinary session today.

While officials refuse to discuss the new policy, the vernacular newspapers agree on its main outlines. They declare that it means "concessions to Russia." It is indicated that the principal basis in the new stand are that Russia shall apologize verbally for the Nikolievsk massacre and shall grant long time concessions to Japanese interests for mining and lumbering in northern Saghalien but that claims for similar concessions in Siberia shall be waived; that a joint Russo-Japanese corporation shall be given the right to exploit the oil resources of northern Saghalien; that the provisions of the Portsmouth treaty, which ended hostilities between Japanese and Czarist Russia, shall be retained with a provision extending Japan's fishing rights in Siberian waters and that the question of payment of debts contracted by the Czarist regime shall be left for settlement after conferences have been held with Great Britain and Italy.

The government's decision as taken today will form the basis of instructions which the minister will take back to Peking with him, instructions which he will be able to interpret in the light of facts gained on an inspection trip through northern Saghalien which he made while away from his legation.

The new policy was presented by the foreign minister, Baron Shidehara, and is generally regarded as fixing Japan's terms to Russia and making an agreement between the countries looking to resumption of diplomatic relations, easier.

The vernacular press here declares that the cabinet fully accepted Baron Shidehara's program, which was framed in such terms as to seniority both the army and the navy. Later always a powerful force in Japanese diplomacy long has desired to retain for Japanese use the resources of northern Saghalien, a territory which Japan has held under occupation for a time pending preparation for the massacre of some six hundred Japanese troops and citizens at Nikolievsk, March 11 and 12, 1920, by Soviet forces.

The vernacular newspapers declare that if Russia accepts such terms, that Japan will cease her occupation of northern Saghalien, withdrawing her troops before the end of October, and will grant recognition to the Soviet regime.

MERCURY HITS HIGH POINT

Ninety-Nine Degrees Was Maximum Reached Here Yesterday.

HUMIDITY IS LOW

Observer Leaving for Portland to Inaugurate New Fire Warning Service.

The temperature yesterday reached 99 degrees, the second highest point reported this year, according to the local U. S. weather bureau. On Sunday, June 23, the mercury pushed 100 degrees, the hottest day of the year, but yesterday's maximum was a close second. Accompanying the heat was an extreme drop in humidity, the relative amount of moisture dropping from 25 degrees, reported the first of the week to 13 degrees yesterday. This condition makes the fire situation extremely critical and is responsible for the great outbreak of fires all over the county.

Charles L. Dacus, who has been taking the place of Observer Bell, who with his wife has been on a vacation in the coast section of Washington state, leaves this evening for Portland to take charge of the new service which the weather bureau is inaugurating during the fire season.

Mr. and Mrs. Bell returned today, following Mr. Dacus, and his first duties in Portland will be to organize a statewide service which will give daily reports to the various individuals, organizations, and departments engaged in fire control and suppression throughout the state.

He will establish ten key stations from which daily reports on humidity, temperature, barometer readings, etc., will be secured, and from these reports will be prepared fire condition reports which will be distributed to all sections, in order to enable the various fire fighting concerns to know of conditions in advance and make all necessary preparations.
