MAN DROWNED AT BRICKYARD

Mexican Section Hand Loses Life While Swimming in Umpqua.

COUNTRYMEN HELD

Two Mexicans Under Investigation on a Charge Plundering Clothing of Dead Man.

Jose Osuno, a Mexican section hand, was drowned yesterday evening while swimming near the brickyard in the south part of the city. Rufugio Basques, and Aljo Muello, are being investigated on the theory that one or both plundered the dead man's clothing and removed some money and a gold watch which he possessed. Osuno was swimming alone, but Basques and Muello were on the bank.

Basques, through an interpreter, informed the officers that he saw Osuno throw up his hands and go down, but did not realize that the man was drowning as he had been playing around in the water. He says they waited for a few minutes expecting him to reappear and then Basques says he went to the bunk house to obtain help.

Coroner Ritter was called and Keith Wright, his assistant, dove for the body and brought it to the surface, but as the body had been in the water almost 2 hours, by that time, nothing could be done to restore life.

At that time the officers did not know that any person other than Basques had witnessed the accident, and he was placed in jail for investigation when it was found that there were only \$11 in the clothes. Osuno cashed a check for \$36 Saturday and also had other money and a gold watch.

This morning Muello obtained a pass and left the city although he was offered a good section job, and given every inducement to stay. After his departure, which appeared quite hurried, it was found that he had also been a witness of the accident, and word was sent to officers in the southern part of the state to arrest and hold the Mexican for examination.

Osuno, so far as is known, had no relatives in this country. He has been employed for several months as a section worker.

POLICE SEARCH FOR MEDFORD MAN

PORTLAND, July 28.—Police here today are conducting a search for James E. Bradley, route 2, Ross Lane Medford, whom they suspect met with foul play while enroute from Medford to Portland in his automobile. R. C. Mann, Los Angeles salesman while walking about the streets late Saturday evening was accosted by a man who introduced himself as James Bradley of Medford, saying he was on his way to Vancouver to see the races. The two spent the evening together and then the man posing as Bradley gave Mann a garage claim check for an automobile, saying that he, Mann might as well have the use of the car for a couple of weeks. Mann's suspicions were aroused and after obtaining the car reported the matter to the police.

Bradley's ownership of the car was established through the license number, but relatives of Bradley living here state that the description of the man purporting to be the Medford man does not fit the real Bradley.

In the car were found several notes and a coat. The notes were taken to the address given on one of them and identified by Beside E. Culp. From the description of the man, Mrs. Culp identified him as Frank Folks, who is said to be a prospector along the Rogue river.

Messages from the Medford police indicated that Bradley left there several days ago for Vancouver.

The authorities are working on the theory that Bradley might have been murdered while on the way to Portland and that his assailant had taken his car and story. Mann said that the stranger had a considerable amount of money on his person. An effort is being made to locate Folks.

SCIENTISTS WILL EXPLORE ISLANDS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

WASHINGTON, July 28.—Scientific exploration of the islands of the south Pacific "with the possibility always existing of eventually throwing light on the origin of the American Indians" is again in progress with the navy mine sweeper Whippoorwill, commanded by Lieutenant Commander S. W. King, carrying the party of government scientists. The ship sailed from Honolulu July 24, to carry forward

similar work done a year ago by explorers on the sweeper Tanager.

A navy department announcement says that a cruise this year will carry the Whippoorwill to the islands of Nipon and Laysan, 500 miles to the westward of Abouan in the Hawaiian group where the work done by the Tanager party a year ago will be verified. Later the trip will take in Howland, Baker, Jarvis and Washington Islands proceeding thence to Pitcairn, Henderson and Rapa Islands and other little known points in the south Pacific.
