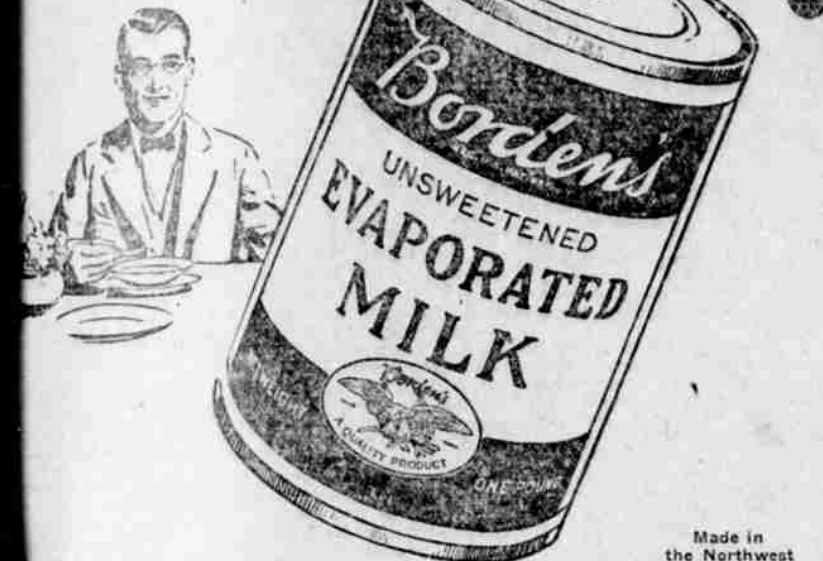

TRUSTIES ESCAPE FROM PEN GUARD

SALEM, Aug. 1.—David Penwell and Fred Howard, trustees of the Oregon state penitentiary here, made good their escape this morning when they broke from a truck that was hauling flax from Rickwall, a small town ten miles southwest of here, to the pen. The escape was made while the truck was undergoing repairs at a garage in the Salem downtown district and while Charles McKinley, the guard in charge of the crew, was inside the garage after a hammer to the repair work on the truck.

The two men remained on the truck while the guard entered the garage. Both were gone when he returned. Prison officials have no intimation of what direction the pair have taken in their escape.

Both men were serving short terms. Penwell was received on October 13, 1923 from Marion county to serve a five year term for forgery. Howard was received August 6, 1923 from Multnomah county where he was sentenced to serve not over 3 years for larceny not in a dwelling.

LIVESTOCK SHOW MAY BE POSTPONED

PORTLAND, Aug. 1.—A decision as to whether the Pacific International Livestock Exposition will be held this year or postponed as a result of the destruction of the pavilion by fire, will be made Monday at board of directors meeting. The directors will have before them two proposals to choose from, one the speedy construction of a new pavilion in time to stage the big livestock show this fall, and the other, to cancel the show for a year to afford more time so that the rebuilding may be done more economically.

Most of the directors favor rushing the construction work and putting on the show this year, according to W. D. Dodson, general manager.

RAILROADS ENTER INTO AGREEMENT

Portland, Aug. 1.—The Southern Pacific and Western Pacific will begin the use of each others line for double track service between Alazon near Wells and Weso, near Winnemucca, Nevada, a distance of 182 miles, today, August first. This follows the agreement reached between the two companies in March last.

President William Sprague of the Southern Pacific company said yesterday in this connection. "This agreement together with the double track construction under way in the Sierra Nevada and East Gorge will give the Southern Pacific 559 miles of double track between San Francisco and Ogden, leaving only 194 miles of construction to complete double track for the entire distance between these points—aside from the 14 miles of track across Great Salt Lake.

The agreement made effective at this time will enable the Southern Pacific to move the peak of traffic with greater expedition than heretofore.

The contract with the Western Pacific provides for reconstruction of that company's line between Weso and Alazon to standard suitable in very large increase in traffic that is now over it and Western Pacific has been engaged in the work of reconstruction accordingly.

tween Alazon and Weso will be used as the west bound track and the Western Pacific line as the east bound track. As the lines are closely parallel except at Battle Mountain, the communities along the line will have access to the service in both directions. At Battle Mountain a bus line will be operated without charge to make connection between the two lines."

SAO PAULO REVOLT RUMORS ARE SPREAD

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, Aug. 1.—It was stated in an authoritative quarter here late yesterday that the Sao Paulo, Brazil, revolt will be on a formidable footing, notwithstanding the rebel withdrawal from Sao Paulo city.

The withdrawal, it was said, was a strategic one, and to avoid the effect of a bombardment of the city. The rebel army of 30,000 is said to be proceeding to the interior.

UNCHECKED FIRES SWEEP TIMBER IN CAL. AND OREGON

SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 1.—A crew of 200 fire fighters including all the employees of the White Pine Sash company's mill and logging camps were fighting a fire today that had burned over 7,000 to 8,000 acres four miles northwest of Kettle Falls, Wash., and was advancing along a front of 10 to 12 miles on Nancy creek. The blaze is burning in white pine, fir and cedar timber in the Coiville national forest and has only to cross a hill to get into one of the finest stands of white pine in the district. Reinforcements of 300 men have been asked from this city.

The fire was burning out of all control this forenoon. T. P. Kelley state fire warden, reported over the long distance telephone, and had covered an area 18 miles square. The fire is burning in virgin growth government timber, he said.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 1.—A half score fires continue out of control in national forests in California while hundreds of new emergency workers are moving into the long fire lines and the United States army in assisting with airplanes and troop patrols.

In the Tahoe forest a fire near Floriston new a week old had jumped up a number of control lines. The town itself is not reported to be in danger. In the forest hill divide region of the same forest an uncontrolled fire is going along the middle fork of the American river. An airplane reconnaissance was started today over an uncontrolled fire in the Bantiste canyon of the Cleveland national forest. This fire is having its own way in rough country and with thousands of acres of brush to keep it alive.

The fire near Quincy, in Plumas National forest was controlled last night, but jumped the fire lines today and is running fast up Mill Creek canyon away from the town.

Sparks from this fire is causing smaller fires in adjoining fields.

The fire at Nelson, a point ten miles south of Quincy, is still out of control after burning for
