TROTZKY ATTACKS U. S. 'IMPERIALISM'

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
MOSCOW, Aug. 6.—The "pacifist" character of the "American Imperialism" formed the chief subject of a lengthy address delivered by War Minister Trotsky on the prospects of international progress, published today. The address was given before several thousand workers and communist students last week on the tenth anniversary of the outbreak of the World War.

Trotsky said he considered it a paradox and one of history's jokes that "America, which is supported by its industries and which helped to crush Germany in order to keep out a solid competitor, emerged from it (the World War) with a pacifist reputation."

The United States, he said, has now definitely entered the path of imperialistic world politics, and "while it has not yet learned to realize its own great power, it studies on Europe's flesh and bones how to use it."

Referring to a recent speech by Secretary Hughes in London, Trotsky said: "America already dictates to Europe, but its chief aim is to put capitalist Europe on rails and to Balkanize it. The United States 'pacifist' is full of grave consequences as it prepares the ground for new wars and stupendous consequences."

The Soviet minister emphasized that America's attempt to "put Europe on rails" could not pass without national and class resistance. He urged the European proletariat to unite in order to combat this "imperialistic Americanism."

TO HOLD CHILD CLINIC AT DRAIN

Mrs. Ellen Post, county health nurse, spent yesterday at Iwain, where she made arrangements for a preschool child and infant clinic to be held on Monday, August 18. This clinic will be conducted by Dr. Estelle Ford Warner, who will have the assistance of local physicians and members of the county health department. The clinic is open to all children of a preschool age and infants, and Dr. Warner especially desires that the mothers of children who will start school this fall, have their children present for the clinic. Free examinations will be made, and mothers will be given advice and information which will be beneficial to the child's future health. Children will not be scored and will not be treated at the clinic. They will, however, be examined for any defects, and the mothers will be given advice which will be of value in preparing the child for starting its school training.

FLOOD DAMAGE GREAT

MADRAS, British India, Aug. 6.—The floods in southern India, which, according to previous dispatches submerged half the state of Cochin, caused at least 100 deaths at Malabar, according to official reports. The loss of life elsewhere was comparatively small. It is estimated that 50,000 persons are homeless, while thousands of acres of crops have been ruined.

One of the first settled spots in southern Oregon, it was the scene of many exciting adventures in the early days, and it is surrounded by memories and stories which today thrill those who know of the pioneer events only by hearsay. On the three days set for the homecoming, however, there will be an opportunity for the history lover to learn much concerning these early days adventures and events for pioneers from all sections will gather to recount old times. Roseburg is to be well represented and a number of residents of this city are planning to attend. The program for the three days follows:

Thursday, August 14, 3 p. m., assembling at the foot of Battle Rock; address by Hon. Blaine H. Heman; address by Captain Kidd of the Coos Bay Pirates; 5 p. m., Indian muck-muck (shell fish of every description served from the Indian pits); production of the Battle of Battle Rock.

Friday, August 15, 10 a. m., sightseeing. A trip to the many beautiful and scenic coves. 12 noon a basket lunch served by the ladies of Port Orford at the Agate Beach Camp ground. Trout fishing on the lake. Fresh and salt water bathing; 8 p. m., old time dance. Ladies will wear hoop skirts. Gentlemen will dispense with boiled shirts.

Saturday, August 16, a drive over the Roosevelt highway. Trips to Cape Blanco and other places of interest; 7 p. m. Around the camp fires on the beach. Reminiscences of early days told by pioneers.

CONVICTED MAN WANTS LICENSE

SALEM, Aug. 6.—Charles A. Carroll, of Bend, who with H. J. Overturf and others was convicted and fined in the federal court in connection with alleged frauds in the appraisal of lands for the state bonus and loan commission has applied to the state real estate department for a license to operate as a real estate agent. His application was turned down by Will Moore, real estate commissioner, but Carroll demands a hearing, which he is entitled to under the law. The hearing will be at Bend August 18, conducted by W. A. Mullin, deputy real estate commissioner. It is said Carroll has operated without a license.

SALEM, Aug. 6.—Frank I. Dunbar of Astoria, former secretary of state, has been appointed an appraiser for the state land board. He will examine lands on which the state is forced to foreclose because of delinquent interest payments on loans from the irrevocable school fund.
