EX-SERVICE MAN GETS PROMOTION

SALEM, Aug. 12.—Major W. P. Simpson, who for two years has been acting as secretary of the ex-service men's state aid commission and who has been a stormy petrel in that department, was yesterday promoted to secretary of state and given the rank of major.

Simpson became acting secretary upon the resignation of Captain Harry Brumbaugh from the secretaryship.

A part of this feeling between Simpson and White grew out of charges made by Simpson a few months ago against a national guard officer in the employ of the bonds and loan department to the effect that he had turned in false reports and been guilty of insubordination.

BENNY LEONARD IS INJURED IN FIGHT

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
CLEVELAND, Ohio, Aug. 12.—Benny Leonard, world's lightweight boxing champion, returning to the ring after nearly a year's absence, scored a decisive, but costly victory over Pat Moran of New Orleans here last night, when he defeated the challenger in a ten round contest, winning all but one of the rounds by a wide margin.

The champion suffered a lacerated ligament of the right thumb with a possible fracture of the distal phalanx, when he went crashing down to Moran's head in the fourth round. The injury physicians said today will prevent Leonard from engaging Mickey Walker, world's welterweight champion, in a 15 round contest scheduled for the Yankee stadium a week from tomorrow.

Leonard's physicians said he would probably be forced to rest at least a month before he would be in condition to resume training.

Leonard left for New York today to submit the injury to specialists for an x-ray examination. If the injury is as serious as the physicians' examination indicated Leonard will request that his match with Walker be postponed until probably September 15.

**COOLIDGE NOT TO
SPEAK VERY MUCH**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12.—President Coolidge's speaking engagements are being held to a minimum and unless the situation changes in the early part of his campaign, is considered likely he will not leave Washington, except for his vacation, on any speaking tour.

Aside from his address accepting the nomination to be delivered here Thursday night at the formal nomination exercises, the president has only one other speaking engagement definitely listed—at the unveiling here October 1, of the First Division memorial statue.

WOMAN ASKS HUGE DAMAGES OF KLAN

MCMINNVILLE, Ore., Aug. 12.—Suit for \$50,000 damages has been filed here against the Ku Klux Klan and the Women of the Ku Klux Klan, as well as sundry individuals, alleged to be members of the organizations by Edna P. Cummins, in the Yamhill circuit court, who charges defamation of character.

In her complaint Mrs. Cummins sets forth that she is well and favorably known in Dundee and Newberg, and that prior to her filing suit she was a member of the Women of the Ku Klux Klan, holding the office of "Night hawk" in the Klan auxiliary.

FIVE MINERS SHOT DOWN FROM AMBUSH

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
WILBURTON, ORE., Aug. 12.—Ambushed on the way home from work last night, five non-union workers in the Bull Hill coal mine 18 miles east of here, were shot down and one seriously wounded by unidentified men hidden in an underground.

As the men, the first of a large party of miners, who had just completed the day's shift, started to cross a creek near the mine, they were met with bullets, mowing them down.

No less than 20 shots were fired, the men informed Sheriff Austin Park, who reported the scene an hour after the shooting.

Everett Edwards, 26 years old, the most seriously injured received two charges of buckshot in the abdomen, chest and face. Ace Williams and Bill Wilson, received face and chest wounds, but none of a serious character.

McKiey said he saw three men run from the scene.

The Bull Hill mine employed 50 men and has been operating as a non-union mine several weeks. Although feeling in that vicinity is tense, work was resumed today. Last week a non-union worker was fired upon from ambush and wounded.

Many persons from the Harborside Wilburton mining district were gathering here today for the preliminary hearings of the 37 union miners charged with participating with the raid on the Bull-Hill open shop mine at Cambria last month.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12.—Invitations have been extended Senator La Follette, independent candidate for president, to deliver campaign addresses, at state fairs, but it was doubtful today whether he will accept any of them.

The Wisconsin senator, it was said, intends to devote one or more speeches before election day on the agricultural situation in sections which it is a paramount issue.

There is little probability of the senator getting under way with speech-making for three or four weeks yet.

DUTCH TURN DOWN LEAGUE GUARANTEE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
GENEVA, Aug. 12.—The Dutch government has followed the example of the United States, Great Britain and Germany in rejecting the league of nations proposed treaty of mutual guarantee. It was made known late yesterday when the secretariat of the league published in full the letter in which Holland rejected the treaty as the basis for disarmament.

The letter, which is signed by H. A. Van Karmbeek, former president of the league of nations assembly, declares that the regional agreements of aid in cases of aggression, provided by the treaty, not only are contrary to the spirit of the covenant of the league, but would be a constant menace to peace. The letter doubts if such measures would tend to reduce armaments as the various nations would be likely to accept the limitations as a minimum instead of a maximum.

The Dutch communication expresses the conviction that disarmament cannot be accepted by any organization of a military character based on force but rather by the making the league universal and seeking world wide adoption of its principles especially those binding the league members to settle disputes peacefully.

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GOOD PHEASANTS LIBERATED IN STATE

EUGENE, Aug. 12.—Practically 6000 Chinese pheasants have been liberated in the state of Oregon since June 15 of the present year, according to Gene Simpson, superintendent of the game farms of Oregon, who is a Eugene visitor. A truckload of the birds was taken to Gaston today, and another shipment was made to Hillsboro Friday. All of the birds liberated in the state are raised at the Eugene and Corvallis pheasant farms.

In the western part of the state the birds are taken to the points of their liberation in trucks, two truckloads usually making the trip at a same time carrying 525 birds. Hood River and Grants Pass are the longest truck hauls, the pheasants going by rail to eastern Oregon.

A new state game farm is to be started near Pendleton this fall, and will be ready for operation next spring, Mr. Simpson said. The farm will be patterned after the state game farm northeast of Eugene.

Pheasant eggs are still being gathered at the state game farm here, and hatching is still going on. Approximately 10,000 birds will be raised here this year, and an additional 5000 at Corvallis.

The birds are able to take care of themselves and are ready for release after they are from six to eight weeks old. Last year there were 10,000 liberated, and this year there is every indication that many more than that will be turned loose.

Lane county has not received her quota as yet, as the plans of the state game commission are for a little later liberation here.

It is possible that nearly 5000 birds will be held at the game farm here during the winter, as the local farm is the largest pheasant holding station in the world. If the birds are held over, they will be liberated in the spring.
