To try to increase consumption, the week of August 24 will be designated as egg week and August 30 will be egg day, the council plans.

SUBMARINE CARRIES ARMS TO CHINESE

MANILA, Aug. 12.—An old submarine chaser—No. 1—sold by the United States recently to private interests is said to have carried to China a quantity of arms and ammunition stolen from the government storehouse here.

Shanghai officials say an attempt was made to land the munitions for delivery to Chinese revolutionists.

Authorities here decline to state the amount of munitions stolen. The arms were concealed to a tank aboard the submarine chaser which was said to contain fuel oil.
