First among these is the issue of government. The speaker voted a major part of his address—delivered in a rain of rain—to a discussion of this issue. He laid full emphasis upon the republican party corruption in office and that some of those in high in the administration had an effort to weaken the

of the exposures at Washington by crying out not against the guilty but against those who posed them.

"I charge the republican with corruption in administration," Mr. Davis declared in legislation. I also charge with division in council and impotence in action."

Passing to a discussion of economic conditions, Mr. Davis warned the administration in offering the ten tax bill to save the possessors of wealth the and declared that in the event of the Fordney-McCumber tariff act there had been a blushing return to the way of rewarding party support political contributions with relative favoritism.

The administration's policy was denounced by the speaker who declared that in this there had appeared the symptoms of a creeping paralysis. He stated that if he became president America would sit as an equal among equals whenever she met at all in conference with nations of the world. With respect to the league of nations, he said the democratic could not accept a treaty authorized by any expression of popular will, that the closed incident in France which is concerned, he said was endorsed as it was declared he deemed it the chief executive's duty "officially" by overman's command, with all his endeavors, whether by the league or from any source, to lessen the possibility of war and to promote peace.

While omitting direct reference to the Ku Klux Klan, he declared for religious liberty and told his audience that every thinking American must make such a declaration.

Referring to anti-Semitism, he said he had no special preference for either.
