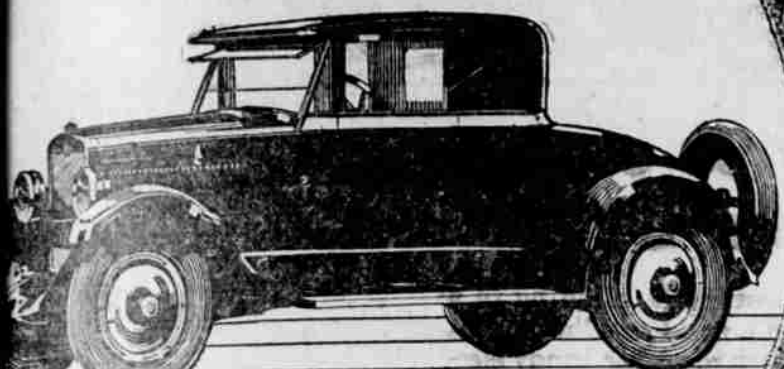

WHITES ARE SERFS TO BLACKS IN THE INTERIOR OF AFRICA

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

LONDON, Aug. 19.—Out of the great African interior by way of Cape Town comes a pathetic story of a group of white men and women who are living in a state of subjection to blacks, who exercise complete mastery over them.

The tragic fate of these unfortunate whites has just been revealed in a report which officials of the south African government's latest expedition, now in the interior of the great Kalahari desert have sent to Cape Town.

When they arrived at Mopolito they found the native chieftain to speak English fluently.

The visitors discovered some fifty white men and women living near the chief's kraal, where they act as servants. They are thought to be descendants of old Dutch pioneers, who, trekking into the interior, lost themselves in the desert and flung themselves on the mercy of the natives.

These unfortunates have no power to own land and no privileges of any kind. They are virtually serfs to the blacks, tilling the land of their black masters, who give them small quantities of grain as wages.

BRAZILIAN TROOPS SINK REBEL BOAT

BUENOS AIRES, Aug. 19.—The Brazilian troops stationed on the banks of the river Parana sank a steamship carrying rebel forces proceeding from the Port of Itabora, according to official advices from Pirajui forwarded by La Nación's Santos correspondent. The boat went down after heavy firing and many of the rebels were drowned.

Advices also say several troops engaged rebel patrols at Campos Novos which is 26 miles west of Sao Paulo and 15 miles north of the Parana border.

SENATOR HARRISON WINS REELECTION

JACKSON, Miss., Aug. 19.—Mississippi democratic voting in its primary election here yesterday returned to the senate Senator Pat Harrison and apparently three congressmen who were offered for re-nomination. Four members of the house were unopposed.

One new congressman will be present among the delegation.

Senator Harrison defeated his only opponent, former Governor Earl Browder, by the largest majority ever received. Mr. Harrison carried every county in the state, democratic endorsement in this state is equivalent to election.

MASSACHUSETTS TO BACK LAFOLLETTE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

GRAND ISLAND, Neb., Aug. 19.—Senator Robert M. La Follette of Wisconsin and Senator Wheeler of Montana were placed in nomination in Nebraska for the presidency and the vice presidency and electors pledged to support them in the electoral college should they carry Nebraska.

In November were named by the Massachusetts convention which met here yesterday and formed a political organization designated as the La Follette Independent party. The meeting after selecting a state central committee, adjourned without placing state congressional tickets in the field to oppose candidates of the two major parties.

The convention obtained between six and seven hundred signatures to a party agreement, according to Otto Mutz, retired farmer of Lincoln, who was chosen chairman of the central committee. The new party will be entitled to function as a full-fledged political party with designation on the general election ballot.

Naming of a state ticket and congressional nominees, was decided against on the floor after W. J. Taylor of Merina put up a stiff argument for it and conflicting opinion had been expressed.

A platform which was affirmation of the resolutions of the conference for progressive political action at Cleveland July 5, was adopted by the convention just before adjournment.

Lincoln was made the headquarters and cooperation with the regional La Follette offices there was decided upon.

SOVIET AMBASSADOR PUZZLES DIPLOMATS

PEKING, Aug. 20.—Members of the Japanese legation here held a long conference today in an effort to reach a decision as to just what disposition should be made of the communication now held by K. Yoshizawa, senior diplomat at Peking, from L. M. Karakhan, Russian ambassador to China in which the soviet representative refused to accept conditions laid down by the United States minister as a member of the diplomatic corps in turning the Russian legation over to the Soviet government.

The reply from Karakhan as a direct answer to a note sent by the United States ministry, through Yoshizawa, in which the American government wished the Soviet government to understand that the turning over of the old Czarist legation to the Soviet in no wise constituted recognition of the Soviet by the United States.

The course of the Japanese minister in handling the correspondence further was undetermined after the conference today and it was intimated the matter may be referred to Tokio for advice.

The attitude of the American legation today that its duty was accomplished when Ambassador Karakhan became apprised of the attitude of the Washington government and that no further comment would be forthcoming.

WILLIE RITCHIE TO ATTEMPT COMEBACK

OAKLAND, Aug. 20.—Willie Ritchie, lightweight champion of the world from 1912 to 1914, will attempt to take the first step of his promised "come-back" when he boxes four rounds with Joe Simonich, a welterweight from Butte, Mont., at the auditorium here tonight.

When he decided about a year ago, that he would attempt to demonstrate he was still a first class fighter, Ritchie hoped to secure another bout with Benny Leonard, lightweight champion who knocked him out in eight rounds at Newark, N. J., in a fight in 1919, he was unsuccessful in this and the former champion now hopes to work his way up to such a battle by a beating some of the best of the four round fighters in general.

Dr. Pearl's statistics dealing with the vitality of native and foreign born Americans are based on studies of the birth and death figures from registration states during the period from 1915 to 1921 inclusive. They show that the native born Americans, whose birth rate was practically equal to death rate in 1915, rose to 142 births to 100 deaths in 1921. In 1915 foreign born mothers were giving birth to 267 children to every 100 deaths among the foreign born. In 1921 their proper 'on of births had fallen to 237.

This shows that the foreign born birth rate, though still the larger, is on the decline, while the native birth rate is increasing.

"Constantly improving conditions of public health," says Dr. Pearl, "and their relation to the mortality returns have taken away any force that might at some time possibly have been thought to attach to the 'race suicide' argument against the general falling birth rate. Any population or any group that year by year is producing more than one baby for each death is not on the high road to extinction."

Dr. Pearl's method for arriving at the maximum future population of the United States is based on the application of a complicated mathematical formula in the figures of the past. In calculating that the United States will not support a population of much more than 197,000,000 at any time he points out that, though this is but 65 persons to the square mile, it is not reasonable to suppose that this country can have a population of 673 to the square mile like Belgium, which is supported mainly by imported food. With the growing demands for food and the other parts of the world Dr. Pearl does not think it is likely that any part of the globe can be depended on
