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SAYS ENGLAND HAS COMMERCIAL FLEET

WILLIAMSTOWN, Mass., Aug. 19.—Great Britain dominates the league of nations and the commerce of the world and inspired limitation of armament to prevent the United States from having a sufficiently strong navy to protect a merchant marine which would compete with that of England, said Rear Admiral W. L. Rodgers, U. S. N., retired, in a statement today at the institute of politics.

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HAROLD GLASOU IS VICTIM OF NEURITIS

MAHSHFIELD, Aug. 19.—Harold J. Glasou, proprietor of the Chandler hotel, died last night in Portland, where he has been taking treatment for neuritis at the House sanitarium, according to word received here today. Mrs. Glasou was at his bedside but his mother, Mrs. Osburn is traveling in Europe.

Death came unexpectedly, although he has been ill for a long time. He left for Portland three weeks ago but his condition was not regarded especially serious. Mrs. Glasou went to Portland last week believing that he was improving steadily.

Glasou came to Mahshfield last spring when he purchased the Chandler hotel with H. J. McKeown and later bought the entire property and formed a corporation with his wife and parents as the principal stockholders. He had been in the hotel business for many years, first being connected with the Osburn hotel in Eugene, and then with the Umpqua Hotel in Roseburg.

Glasou was about 38 years old and made many friends during his short stay on Coos Bay. He was a Shriner, an Elk, Kiwanian, Coos Bay Phrathe and Legionnaire. He served as lieutenant during the world war.

Glasou was about 29 years old and is survived by his wife and parents. Burial services are expected to be delayed until the arrival of the parents from Germany. They were notified at Nuremberg, Germany, and have started on the return. Burial will probably be held in the family plot at Eugene, although definite announcement has not been made.
