DARROW STARTS PLEA FOR BOYS

ter of the law as you please and not hang these boys. For back of the statutory law is the law of justice and of humanity and in that statute is the law of choice of punishment.

CHICAGO, Aug. 22.—That Nathan Leopold, Jr., and Richard Loeb have paranoid personalities was the direct statement made today to Judge John R. Caverly, by Walter Bachrach one of the attorneys who are trying to save from the gallows the admitted murderers of Robert Franks.

Mr. Bachrach devoted much of his argument to an analysis of the medical testimony asserting that the alienists had taken insufficient opportunity to study the youths.

He also intimated that these observations had been made with the idea of stopping a defense based upon legal insanity, and therefore failed to take into consideration symptoms which would show a mental disease short of insanity.

Mr. Bachrach quoted testimony given by Dr. Hugh T. Patrick, a state alienist, on cross-examination to prove his point as to the character of the state's investigation.

"We do not claim that these boys are stupid, or do not realize where they are," said Mr. Bachrach. "But that the fact that they are higher intelligence and do realize, it is taken in connection with the other circumstances, evidence that they are paranoid."

Mr. Bachrach named Loeb's use of long promises in his logic and Leopold's delusions of grandeur and holding him as super-man, as the chief corollary facts.

"A paranoid may consider himself equal to king, to Napoleon, to Christ or even God Almighty," said Mr. Bachrach. "He need not say he is equal, but if he acts as if he believed himself in that exalted sphere it is evidence of a paranoid personality."

stationed near Fredericksdal because of the dense fog near the coast.

ABOARD U. S. S. RICHMOND, ON PATROL BETWEEN ICELAND AND GREENLAND, Aug. 22.—Rear-Admiral Thomas A. McGruder has ordered the United States cruisers Richmond and Raleigh and the destroyer Barry to make a search east of Cape Farewell, Greenland, for Lieutenant Locatelli, Italian aviator, who accompanied the American round the world fliers.

The search will be made by means of the planes carried by the cruisers for scouting purposes and will be continued indefinitely.

Admiral McGruder is preparing to send out a general alarm if Locatelli is not found soon. It is believed by some of the officers of the Richmond that the Italian aviator may have proceeded to Triligit instead of halting at Fredericksdal.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22.—Lack of official confirmation of safety of the American round the world fliers in Greenland after their 825 mile hop from Iceland gave little concern early today to army and navy officials. Communication officers of both services watched all night for a direct message from the aviators.

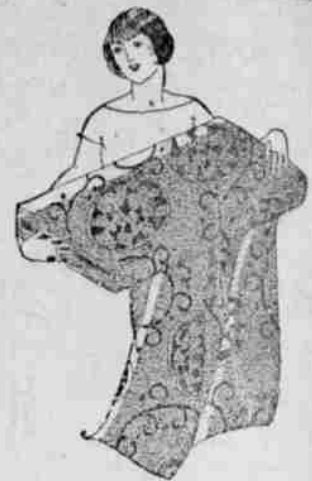

BELLINGHAM, Wash., Aug. 22.—Major Frederick L. Martin, commander of the United States army round the world airman until his flag plane Seattle collided with a mountain on the Alaska peninsula, putting him out of the light, declared that the flight of the American aviators from Iceland to Greenland was "wonderful" when informed by the Associated Press last night of the progress of the fliers.

"I am glad to hear that their troubles with ice flocs are near-

ly over," said Major Martin. ON BOARD U. S. S. LAWRENCE, Indian Harbor, Labrador, Aug. 22.—Wireless advice received aboard the Lawrence this afternoon indicated the American army round the world

fliers planned to sail from Fredericksdal, west coast of Greenland (Friday), and was stated the aviators had to hop off from the harbor.
