DAWES IS TESTING REACTION CAUSED BY CAMPAIGN TALK

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
ENROUTE TO CHICAGO WITH GENERAL DAWES AT ALBANY, N. Y., Aug. 26.—Satisfaction with the results of his first campaign speaking trip and his conference yesterday with President Coolidge at Plymouth, Vt., was expressed by Charles G. Dawes, republican vice-presidential nominee today, as he took up the final stage of his homeward trip to Evanston, Ill.

The vice-presidential nominee planned to spend the day, as the train on which he traveled crossed New York, Ohio and Indiana, at work on his next address—that on the agricultural situation to be made Friday night at Lincoln, Nebraska, the home of his democratic opponent for the vice-presidential nomination, Charles W. Bryan. A portion of the time will also be spent by the nominee in obtaining information as to the reaction of the country of his Ku Klux Klan and trades unionism speech made last Saturday at Augusta, Maine. Ever since Saturday he has been scanning newspaper editorial comment and inquiring of those he met in railroad stations and hotels as to their opinion of his address and today he asserted that he was well pleased with the reaction so far as he had been able to assess it.

Arrival of Mr. Dawes in Chicago tonight will permit him to reach his home in time to spend his fifty-ninth birthday, which he will observe tomorrow with Mrs. Dawes and other members of his family.

MONTANANS NAME COMPLETE TICKET

HELENA, Mont., Aug. 26.—Montana voters went to the polls today to settle a score of democratic and republican contests for nominations, including designations for one United States senator, two national representatives and a complete state ticket.

Party leaders predicted that 60 to 70 per cent of the 211,450 voters registered in the state would cast ballots today. Chief among the contests apparently is that for the republican nomination for United States Senator. Interest also has been stirred up by contests in both major parties for the gubernatorial nomination, farmer labor and socialist party candidates are uncontested.

BADGE BANDIT MAY SERVE LIFE TERM

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 26.—The "badge bandit" career of Harry Dunlap probably will cost him a life time of penal servitude as the result of his conviction in superior court here last night on five counts of robbery, one of criminal assault and one of assault with intent to murder.

On each of the two assault charges he may be given sentences of from 1 to 14 years; on each of two counts of first degree robbery, he may draw from 5 years to life and on each of the three counts of second degree robbery he may receive from 1 year to life. He will appear for sentence next Thursday.

Dunlap was captured in Detroit about a month ago after a nation-wide search and brought here for trial. The crimes charged against him were committed over a period of about two years, and consisted chiefly of the kidnaping of young couples in seducing in automobile "petting parties." His system was to persuade the surprised pair with a device of the sheriff's badge, then rob the man and assault his woman companion.

TEXAS REPUBLICANS MUST CHOOSE MAN

HOUSTON, Aug. 26.—Naming of a candidate for governor to succeed T. P. Lee of Houston, who tendered his resignation following his nomination by the state convention at Fort Worth, was the principal business before the meeting of the republican state executive committee here today.

Lee's resignation came after he congratulated Mrs. Miriam Ferguson, democratic nominee on her success in the July primaries. In this message he is said to have expressed the hope that Mrs. Ferguson would be the democratic nominee for governor. This telegram brought a storm of protest from republicans and was followed by Lee's announcement that he would not accept the republican nomination.
