Robert P. Skinner, Consul-General to London for ten years, has been transferred to the same post in Paris, succeeding Alexander M. Tackaras, who retires for age. Fiorello H. La Guardia, Republican Congressman from New York City, has announced that he will support the La Follette-Wheeler Presidential ticket. YOUNG EVANGELIST SPREADS GOSPEL



12-Year-Old Uldine Utley, Who Will Speak at the Bible Standard Mission on Sunday.

Uldine Maybelle Utley, the 12-year-old nationally known evangelist, who has attracted huge crowds all over the United States by her able sermons and presentation of religious truths, will speak on Sunday at the Bible Standard Mission in the Hochradel building, directly across the street from the News-Review office. At Salem and Eugene where she recently appeared in evangelistic campaigns, she is reported to have spoken to packed houses and to have swayed her audiences with the force of her sermons. She not only preaches but directs the congregational singing and gives charming vocal solos.

She is accompanied by her father and mother and a six year old sister who assist her in the meetings.

Because of the wonderful reputation she has achieved throughout the country, it is very probable that she will be greeted by a crowded house upon her appearance tomorrow.
