MEN NAMED TO FORM BUDGET

County Court Names Budget Committee to Arrange Estimate of Expenses

GOOD MEN CHOSEN

Reedsport, Glendale and Roseburg Represented—
Former County Judge Is Member.

The county court today appointed the budget committee which will check up the expenditures for the past few years and will proceed to map out the proposed expenditures for the coming year. The members of the committee are Joe Lyons of Reedsport, L. H. Smith of Glendale, and George Neuner, of Roseburg.

Mr. Lyons was a former county judge and is now one of the leading business men of Reedsport. He is well versed in county affairs, for in addition to serving as judge he has at frequent intervals had occasion to come in contact with county business and has therefore kept in touch with conditions.

Mr. Smith is mayor of Glendale and is one of the highly respected and responsible business men of that city. He is a man of good judgment, progressive, and is in every way qualified for this important place.

George Neuner was former district attorney and advisor to the county court. Because of his close connection with county affairs for many years, and the fact that he is an attorney will be of great benefit to the county in the preparation of the budget. He is not only able to proceed efficiently toward the formation of a budget which will meet the needs of the county, but he is also able to avoid the legal pitfalls which so often appear before the budget committee which attempts to work without legal help.

The county court feels that this committee is well selected, and well qualified. It represents the widely separate sections of the county, and is made up of men whose business judgment has been proven, and they will no doubt prepare a budget which will be satisfactory in every particular.

MURDER TRIAL TO RESUME TOMORROW

TACOMA, Wash., Oct. 6.—After a two day recess the trial in federal district court of Roland H. Pothier, former sergeant-bugler in the 13th engineers for the alleged murder of Major Alexander P. Cronkhite on the Camp Lewis military reservation two years ago this month, will be continued tomorrow, no court will be held today because Judge Edward E. Cushman, the trial judge, has to sit in Seattle.

Tomorrow marks the second week of the trial, fifteen witnesses having been placed on the stand by the government.

Brigadier General John Richards of Providence, R. I., will be on the stand and will be under direct examination by leaders of the government attorneys, James W. Osborne of New York.

Richards was United States Marshal in Providence when Pothier was arrested on March 17, 1921, and testified Saturday morning refuting in his testimony two phases of the alleged accidental killing of the Major by Pothier in two of his several purporting confessions.

Robert Rosenblath, former captain of the 13th Engineers, will be tried later for complicity in the alleged murder.

THIRD WEEK OF FOOTBALL STARTS

SEATTLE, Oct. 6.—Football eleven in the Pacific Northwest intercollegiate conference, were week of the season after games preparing today for the third Saturday which presented no real upsets.

PRINCE OF WALES IN VICTORIA, B. C.

VICTORIA, B. C., Oct. 6.—Announcement of the itinerary of H. R. H. the Prince of Wales on his return trip to the Atlantic seaboard which made here last night by Captain Allen Lancelotti, private secretary to the prince, upon the arrival of the royal party from Vancouver.

Arriving in Winnipeg Friday October 10, the prince will leave that city on the morning of October 12, traveling by way of Duluth to Chicago, where he will arrive October 15. The prince's visit to Chicago is in response to a long standing invitation from Louis Swift. His stay in that city will be entirely of a private nature, his royal highness having entrusted arrangements for the day's sight-seeing to Mr. Swift.

Detroit will be visited October 14, Toronto October 15, and Ottawa October 16. Arrival at Montreal is planned for October 19. After a two day stay there, the prince will proceed to Massachusetts to be the guest of Bayard Tuckerman, Jr., and to hunt with the Myopia club. The royal party will sail from New York on the White Star liner Olympic October 23.

The prince was given an enthusiastic welcome by thousands of citizens when he arrived here last night.
