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SENATOR'S WIFE AMONG DIVORCE SEEKERS, PARIS

(Associated Press London Wire.) PARIS, Nov. 7.—The latest list of cases filed for hearing in the Paris divorce court contains the names of seven American couples, says the Paris edition of the Chicago Tribune. Among the petitioners are Mrs. Peter Goulet Gurry of New York, wife of the Rhode Island senator, and Mrs. Alice Kriskine Allen of Hempstead, N. Y., wife of Horace Ingelow Allen.

Mrs. Peter Goulet Gurry was before her marriage in May, 1910, Miss Mathilde Townsend of Washington and Philadelphia. She is noted for her beauty and has for some time been among the leaders of society in Washington, New York and New Port.

Senator Gurry, elected to the senate in 1918, is well known as a society man, polo player, sculptor and philanthropist. Mrs. Allen is a daughter of the late David Kriskine Gurry, a nephew of the elder Mrs. Cornelius Vanderbilt. She married Mr. Allen in 1915 after he had completed his service with the American army.

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
