(Associated Press Leased Wire.) CHICAGO, Nov. 21.—When western conference coaches shouted today "that's all" and their proteges tramped from their fields, the curtain rang down on more than two months of football preparations for tomorrow's game upon which so much depends.

Two types of football were in prospect of display in Chicago in the Wisconsin, Chicago and Northwestern—Notre Dame game which held the center of mid-western football interest.

Chicago and Wisconsin each had a fine smashing game ready for their tilt which the maroons must win to be declared undisputed western conference champions.

An open game was expected to develop in the meeting of the Notre Dame and Northwestern before a capacity crowd here. The hard tackling defense of the Rockmen was anticipated by the purple, which has prepared trick plays and forward passing tactics to overcome the monies.

Michigan reviewed its repertoire and added additional formations to spring on Iowa in its last practice of the season.

Ohio state, enroute to Urbana to attempt to deduct further from the prestige Illinois lost to Minnesota, held a light workout at Danville, Ill. Indiana was ready for the invasion of Purdue's camp at La Fayette.
