PALO ALTO, Cal., Nov. 26.—An unidentified man, believed to be one of two suspected safe crackers, who disarmed Policeman L. S. Lawrence here last night and engaged in a pistol fight with Policeman Delbert Gorman, was found shot to death on a Palo Alto street today.

The policemen who were walking a beat together, surprised the two supposed cracksmen as they were acting in a suspicious manner in front of a downtown store. The Gorman disarmed Lawrence, but Gorman opened fire. The man returned the fire, one of the bullets wounding Gorman in the leg.

The dead man was found about four blocks from the scene of the shooting. There was a bullet wound in his chest and nitro-glycerine and dynamite in his pockets.

LONDON, Nov. 26.—British military law recognizes the fact that soldiers are liable to outbursts of profanity, and when a private of the royal dragoons was charged at an Aldershot court-martial recently with using insubordinate language toward a sergeant, he was acquitted upon the grounds that the expressions he used "were common bar room language." The British manual of military law, cited by the defense in the case, says:

"A soldier uses violent language, which is a mere outburst of momentary irritation or extreme, without at all intending to be insubordinate. Allowance must be made for coarse expressions which a man of inferior education will use as mere expletives."

AFTER CHICAGO GUNMEN
