RADIO COMPASS IS GIVEN GOOD TRYOUT

WASHINGTON, Nov. 27.—The first test of the radio compass guide for aviators on an agency flight promises the end of all fears for the flier who must now largely guess his way when fog or haze obscures his view of the earth.

Radio compass mechanism perfected after long experiment by the army air service and signal corps to overcome the handicap of low visibility in flying was given its first practical test yesterday in a flight between the airway points of Dayton, Ohio and Modesto, West Virginia, by Lieutenant George W. Goddard. The result is viewed as having an important bearing upon the development of commercial aviation.

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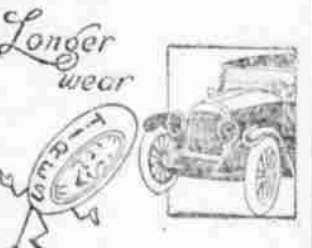
