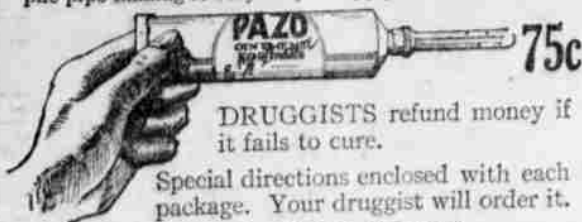

PHONE 220**CRIME WAVE IN CHICAGO SERIOUS**

CHICAGO, Dec. 1.—The series of recent murders, the sudden increase in robberies and a number of kidnappings in which women were abducted and attacked, was blamed yesterday for the deaths Saturday night of one detective, the serious wounding of two others and the death yesterday of a laborer in an elevated station.

Hugh Stewart, bank cashier, fired into a police car in front of his home. Detective William Perrin was killed. Detectives David Van Hoven and Frank Warburton were wounded. Stewart told police he thought the police car contained robbers. He was held pending further investigation.

Charles Hendricks, a laborer, was shot and killed at an elevated station yesterday by Luke Reeson, station agent, who told police he thought Hendricks was a robber. Police said Reeson had been drinking.

George Smith, negro, was arrested last night soon after he was alleged to have attacked three white women. The women identified him, police said.

FOUR LOSE LIVES IN NEW YORK FIRE(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
NEW YORK, Dec. 1.—Three women and two men lost their lives today in a fire which swept a five-story rooming house in West 63rd Street, near Columbus Avenue. Eleven persons were injured, five seriously.

One of the women victims was killed in leaping from the roof and another died after she had been lowered by her husband from the top floor by a rope. The bodies of another woman and two men were found in a hallway.

NEW YORK, Dec. 1.—Four persons, three of them women, lost their lives in a fire which swept a five-story rooming house in West 63rd Street this morning. 33 persons were injured, some of them probably fatally.

One woman was killed in leaping from the roof. The bodies of two other women were found in the hallways of the third and fourth floors.

The man's body was found on the top floor landing. Detectives started search for a motorman whose trolley car cut a hose line laid across Columbus Avenue, the severing of the hose delayed combatting the flames for several minutes.

CHICAGO, Dec. 1.—Brigadier General Charles G. Dawes, vice-president-elect, left his bed yesterday for the first time since he was operated on for hernia, two weeks ago. He walked a little and said he "feels better than ever before."

PRESIDENT CALLES ANNOUNCES CABINET

MEXICO CITY, Dec. 1.—General Plutarco Elias Calles, newly inaugurated president of Mexico, has announced his cabinet as follows:

Secretary of Foreign Relations: Adolfo Salazar, (incumbent). Interior: Deputy Romeo Ortega, who has been sub-secretary in charge of the department. Communications and Public Works: Adalberto Tejeda, governor of Vera Cruz for the last four years.

Industry, commerce and labor: Deputy Luis Morones, the labor leader, who was wounded in a shooting affray a fortnight ago in the chamber of deputies. Agriculture and development: Luis Leon.

Education: Senator Jose Ruiz Cortes.

War and Navy: General Joaquin Amaro, sub-secretary in charge of the department. Ramon Rosa is reappointed governor of the federal district.

It is generally understood that Senator Padi will hold office until the pending loan negotiations are completed. President Calles took his oath of office yesterday in the national stadium before 25,000 persons who included diplomatic missions from 16 foreign powers, General Alvaro Obregon, the retiring president, members of his cabinet and judiciary, military and political personages.

OREGON, AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Nov. 29.—(Special)—George Spaur, senior in forestry, has been pledged to Sigma Phi, national honorary forestry fraternity. Sigma Phi was founded at the University of Washington in 1904. Requirements for membership are leadership in student activities, a consistent high scholarship record, no failures in any subject, and personality.

Spaur is active in student body activities, being manager of the Orange Owl, associate manager of the Oregon State Technical Record chief of staff of the annual Cruise, member managerial staff of the 1924 Beaver and a member of two societies, Kappa Phi Delta, honorary educational fraternity, and Hammer and Coffin, honorary professional publishing society. Spaur is also a member of Theta Delta Nu social fraternity and the O. A. C. Masonic Club.

MCMINNVILLE, Dec. 1.—Damages of \$500 were awarded Mrs. Edna Cummins, by a circuit court jury here yesterday in Mrs. Cummins' suit for \$50,000 libel action by members of the Newberg Ku Klux Klan.

Mrs. Cummins instituted action on grounds that her character had been injured by alleged statements concerning her made by the defendant members of the Newberg Klan. The action originally made the National Klan organization defendant, but the court granted a nonsuit as to the national body. On the grounds that the Klan as a whole is responsible for acts of its members, attorneys for Mrs. Cummins announced they would appeal the decision of the lower court, eliminating the national organization as a defendant to the state supreme court.
