FUNERAL WILL ATTEST GOMPERS' GREAT SERVICE

(Associated Press Local Wire.)
NEW YORK, Dec. 16.—The entire nation, officially and through representatives of finance, business, industry and professions, will share with labor in honoring its dead chieftain, Samuel Gompers, at his funeral here Thursday morning. Several thousand union representatives of more than 45 individual labor groups will attend the services. In addition there will be several hundred men of prominence representing the national, state and city governments, the army and navy, the national guard, banking and other circles.
Invitations have been issued to Secretary Hughes and Chief Justice Taft to act as honorary pallbearers.
The program provides that when the body arrives here over the Baltimore and Ohio railroad from Washington at seven o'clock tomorrow morning it will be met by a composite battalion, representing the army, the navy, and the national guard. The casket will be placed on an artillery caisson and with its military escort and a detachment of labor officials will proceed to the Elks Club. There it will lie in state until the funeral services begin at 9 o'clock Thursday morning.
Masonic services at the grave in Sleepy Hollow cemetery at Tarrytown will be conducted by the Very Rev. Oscar F. R. Trosler, Chaplain of the Grand Lodge of the State of New York.
Body Lies in State
WASHINGTON, Dec. 16.—Thousands of his neighbors in Washington and his co-workers in organized labor are expected to pass by the body of Samuel Gompers, late president of the American Federation of Labor, during the six hours it will lie in state tonight in the Federation building here.
A brief period after arrival of the funeral train this afternoon was set aside for the gathering of members of the immediate family of Mr. Gompers for a last few minutes alone beside his bier and nearly all the time remaining before departure of the train late at night was given over to the general public.
From Washington the funeral train will proceed to New York, where final funeral services are to be held. Short ceremonial services by the Elks and the mystic Shrine are to be held here and the body is to be borne from the Union Station to the Federation building and back to the station again in an impressive funeral cortege, but there will be no formal tribute by the government. The Federation building has since the death of the chieftain in San Antonio and its flag has flown at half mast. A reception room seldom used was chosen to receive the body of Mr. Gompers for its brief rest in

"RED" PERIL MAY UNITE BALKANS

(Associated Press Local Wire.)
SOFIA, Dec. 16.—Commenting on the declaration by the Jugo-Slavian foreign minister, favoring a united front of the Balkan states against Bolshevik activities, the Bulgarian foreign minister, M. Kalloff, is quoted as saying:

"The Jugo-Slavian offer of united action is welcomed here, especially in view of our information that Russian Bolsheviks are organizing an insurrection in Bulgaria this spring. We are ready to join the other Balkan states to save our institutions from subversion by a foreign agency."
"We are glad that Jugo-Slavians and Rumania realize the danger of the Bolshevik activities, which were begun in Bulgaria, the weakest of the Balkan states. We have no desire to interfere in any way in the affairs of our neighbor or Russia, but we are determined to save our own institutions if we can."
