(Associated Press Leased Wire.) BANGOR, Maine, Jan. 2.—A sympathetic strike which for 12 years has prevented the Bangor and Aroostook railroad from operating its trains over the tracks of the Maine central railroad was declared at an end today.

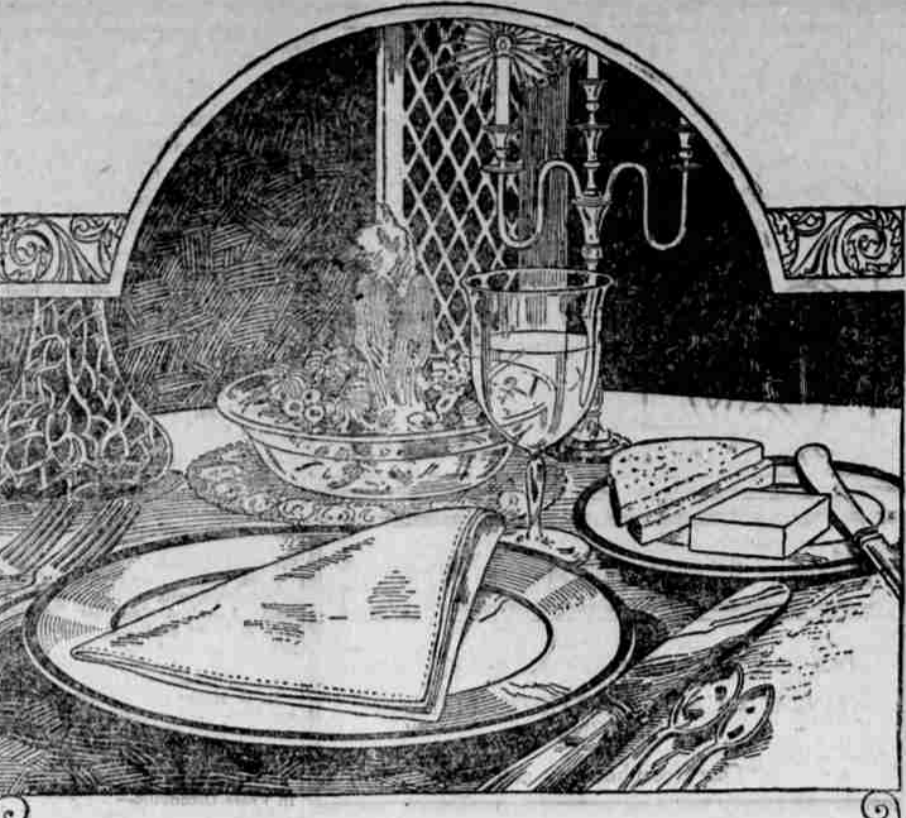
