Dr. Benson said the fir balsam can be used in the preparation of certain medicines and as a substitute for Canadian Balsam in mounting microscopic specimens. He declared five gallons of the balsam can be obtained from an average fir tree.

NOTED VETERAN CHOSEN U. OF O. FOOTBALL COACH

(Associated Press Local Wire.) EUGENE, Ore., Jan. 22.—Richard Shore (Dick) Smith, former University Oregon and Columbia University football star, and a member of the national all-American team for two years, was unanimously elected by the executive council of the University of Oregon last night as head coach of football at the University. He was given a contract with indefinite tenure.

Smith was considered one of the greatest backfield men of his time, playing on the University of Oregon team for four years and then going to Columbia for three years more, where he studied law and again starred as a football player. It was while he was at Columbia that he was placed on the all-American team for two consecutive years.

He played with the Oregon team from 1896 to 1909 and on the Columbia team from 1901 to 1902. With his appointment, there are now two former all-American players holding positions on the Pacific Coast. Andy Smith of California, while back on the Pacific Northwest eleven, also won that distinction.

The new Oregon coach has followed football ever since his college days. He coached the Oregon team in 1903 after completing his law course in the east, and in 1904 he again went east to tutor the Columbia warriors. Changes in the game have been carefully studied by the former star, and in recent years he has aided Oregon coaches before the big games of the year.

While at Oregon, Smith made his letter in track as well as in football and the weight events. At Columbia he was a star in track and on the rowing crew.

CHICAGO, Jan. 22.—Four letters which Harry Olson, chief justice of the Municipal Court, said were written by William D. Shepperd, chief heir of William McDaniel, the "millionaire orphan," to Miss Estelle Eleanor Gehling, a nurse, will figure in the coroner's inquest of McDaniel's death, when it is resumed next month.
