RETIREMENT EMPLOYEES MAY GET MORE PAY

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.—Increased annuities for the 10,548 retired government employees are favored by the president's cabinet.

"The average annual rate paid annuitants under the present law is \$546.30. About one third the total of 10,548 annuitants receive a maximum of \$720; almost another third receive less than \$412, while the lowest annuity now being paid is \$50.60 per annum.

"The retirement from which these annuities are paid has been created by deductions withheld from the salaries of the employees themselves for this purpose. It is their own money. The government so far has not been called upon to appropriate for the support of the retirement fund, and the time when such paternalistic assistance will become necessary by depletion of the fund is not yet in sight.

"More liberal retirement annuities would relieve actual distress now existing in many cases, and for humanitarian reasons, if for no other, the government should provide a more suitable retirement pay than the present annuity."

IRISH REPUBLICAN LEADER IN U. S.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) NEW YORK, Jan. 26.—Miss Mary McSwiney, Irish republican leader and sister of Terence McSwiney, Lord Mayor of Cork, who died after his hunger strike against the British and herself a veteran of a twenty three day hunger strike against the Free State, is in this country to champion the cause of an Irish republic. It was learned today.

Miss McSwiney arrived Friday. She refused to say how she came here and had to admit that she came incovertly.

After addressing a meeting here February 28 she will go on a six months tour of the country. Her last visit here was in August, 1921, shortly after her brother's death.

GAS OUTPUT LESS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.—The value of the output of manufactured gas in the United States was shown in figures made public today by the census bureau to have advanced much less between 1921 and 1923 than that of the products of three other lines of industry.

The 1923 production of gas and by-products was valued at \$450,000,322, an increase of 9.5 percent over the 1921 total, while products of the chemical industry advanced 6.1 percent in the two years, amounting to \$690,493,965 in 1922, and canned fruits and vegetables, with pickles in the same group went up 41 percent to \$515,510,492. The output of canned and preserved seafoods in 1923 was valued at \$50,463,215, an increase of 39.7 percent over 1921.

The chemical statistics did not include sulphuric, nitrate and mixed acids, explosives, fertilizers, or wood distillation products.
