

**BLUE-STRIPED MAIL BAGS ARE ABANDONED**

WASHINGTON, Jan. 27.—The traditional blue-striped United States mail bag is going to give way to the economy test that is being applied in all directions these days by Brigadier General Lord, director of the budget. When budget bureau officials could find no good reason why the government should pay a cent a yard more for the blue-striped canvas than the plain gray variety, General Lord decided that the post office department hereafter will use the latter and thus effect an annual saving of about \$49,000 in the cost of mail bags.
