ST. PAUL, Minn., Jan. 28.—Western and southern railroads are denied a temporary injunction to restrain enforcement of lower express rates in their territories, in a decision of the United States district court filed here today. INJUNCTION DENIED

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) CHICAGO, Jan. 28.—A preliminary injunction to restrain the enforcement of lower express rates in the western district has been denied by the United States district court at St. Louis, according to railroad attorneys here.

The lower rates, ordered some time ago by the interstate commerce commission, were opposed by the western and southern railroads in a bill for injunction filed a month ago at St. Paul and heard at St. Louis by federal Judges Booth, Sanborn and Pollock, with the question of a preliminary injunction removed, the issue is expected to go to further hearing on its merits, according to railway counsel.

New York leads in registrations with 1,412,050, of which 1,136,300 are passenger cars. California is second with 1,327,480. The only other states in the 1,000,000 class are Ohio with 1,227,000; Pennsylvania, 1,221,593; and Illinois, with 1,123,000.
