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HIJACKING PAIR GETS AWAY AFTER THIRD IS KILLED

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 29.—Theodore Eggers, who escaped from the federal prison at Atlanta, Ga., is believed by federal officials to have come to San Francisco to plot the escape of his two brothers, Milo and Ariel, suspected liquor pirates, which lead yesterday to the shooting and killing of Ariel Eggers and the escape of Milo Eggers.

Comparison of the handwriting of "James Callahan," who rented the automobile in which Milo Eggers escaped, with that of Theodore Eggers disclosed many similarities, the federal officials said. They had other evidence, they said, that Theodore Eggers, supposed leader of the sensational hi-jacking ring that operated off the coast of British Columbia, came here from his place of concealment and worked out the plot to free his brother.

Mrs. Erna Brown, believed by investigating officials to be the sister of the Eggers brothers, is being closely questioned today concerning the identity of the woman who drove Theodore Eggers to freedom from the gates of the Atlanta prison after the tires of the police automobile in which he was being brought to that prison exploded mysteriously.
