NURMI FAILS TO SET ANY NEW RECORDS

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

NEW YORK, Jan. 31.—Paavo Nurmi of Finland failed to break any existing records in a one and one-eighth mile race at the Morningside A. C. games last night, his performance being no more than mediocre.

For the first time since the flying feet appeared upon these shores there was an appreciable let down in their activity and Joie Ray would have run away from them easily. Paavo started slowly and made no haste, evidently being content with having appeared at the games and finished the race in front.

Reports during the meet declared that Nurmi was suffering from an injured leg sustained while swimming in a pool and that he was also having a cold, both of which would keep him out of the competition.

Willie Plant and Willie Ritola,

however, were in exceptional form, the walker who defeated Ugo Frigerio of Italy beating his own record for 1.3-8 miles made in 1920 by 2 seconds and Ritola running a remarkable two-mile race in which he caught the handicap men and lapped the field at the finish line. He missed the record by a couple of seconds.

NEW IDEAS FOR CITY BENEFIT ARE ADVANCED

Chamber Commerce Questionnaire Results in Many Suggestions.

EXPECT RESULTS

Program of Work Will Be Made Up From List of Projects Advanced by Members.

The questionnaire recently sent out by the Chamber of Commerce to its members to find out what was wanted during the year 1925, has resulted in less suggestions than the questionnaire sent out in 1924, thus proving to some extent at least that the chamber handled most of the subjects submitted to it last year. The following is a tabulation of the suggestions as received for this year's work:

- Secure large saw-mill located in Roseburg.
- Secure new industries to employ labor.
- Inform like-warm supporters of the chamber what other cities in the state are paying towards their chamber.
- Secure more members for the chamber.
- Get the "Los Angeles spirit" in Roseburg.
- Have scenic footpath built to the top of Mt. Nebo.
- Centralization of city sewer system and extend pipe for outlet further down the river.
- Secure public bath house or pool.
- Secure rest rooms for the strangers and farmers who visit the city.
- Assist the local cannery.
- Assist cooperative organizations of farmers.
- Develop the growing of new crops.
- Build electric lighted welcome signs and arches at each entrance to the city.
- Put on an intensive campaign of advertising at the camp grounds, using films and slides.
- Stand back of the Douglas County Band.
- Get the Coos Bay highway paved. Complete the Redstart highway.
- Build bridge across the river to Umpqua Park.
- Encourage buying at home campaigns.
- Boost for city park.
- Secure a bigger payroll.
- Work for an east and west railroad.
- Continue the 1924 program. Complete the North Umpqua highway.
- Assist the city council in the city beautification campaign.
- Secure more advertising for local farm products.
- Carry out present road building program.
- Complete the overboard crossings on the Pacific highway.
- Complete the Tiller cutoff.
- Cooperation with public officials.
- Support every civic effort of various organizations.
- Promote woolen mill.
- Keep members informed of the chamber doings by means of news letter or bulletin.
- Make Douglas county the strawberry center of Oregon.

COMMITTEE ON FARMER RELIEF SWATS BUREAUS

Administration Handicapped by Jealousy and Dog in Manger Attitude.

BANKS LACK UNITY

Larger Federal Reserve System Recommended

Confirmation of Stone Sure.

(Associated Press Local Wire.) WASHINGTON, Feb. 2.—The house agriculture committee called to open brief hearings, took up today the shaping of recommendations of the president's agricultural committee into a legislative program that will have the best chance of enactment in the final month of the session.

The committee in a third report today criticized the administration of certain federal laws and agencies affecting the farmer. The committee's criticism of the report says, has "failed or been unable to recognize its responsibility as an advocate of the shipper, and has developed into a court," while it held the traffic commission could materially assist agriculture by "actively functioning along the lines of its constituted powers and responsibilities."

The committee charged that "inter-departmental or inter-bureau jealousies" were seriously handicapping the administration of some departments and were causing a "dog in the manger" attitude that was resulting in the undue expansion of some governmental agencies and retarding the development of others.

Declaring agriculture was suffering from the country's lack of a unified banking system, the committee believed that correction for this lay in measures to increase the relatively small membership in the Federal Reserve System and a modification of certain state banking laws.

The outlook for farm legislation this season was discussed with President Coolidge today by Chairman Snell, of the house rules committee. Mr. Snell presented a long list of measures requiring attention, but Coolidge insisted that agricultural relief and the government reorganization bill should be kept out of front.

The house agriculture committee began its hearing by listening to an explanation from the agricultural commission's findings by Hiram P. Merritt, one of the commission members.

Mr. Merritt dwelt at length on the cattle industry, predicting a better price for cattle within a few years and declaring the problem now confronting the industry was both a matter of higher prices and more credit.

Failure of co-operative marketing associations to meet expectations he attributed in many instances to lack of definite plans, inadequate financing, defects in management and failure to bring in sufficient producers.

Mr. Merritt said he could not recommend regulation of production to insure better prices on farm products. He added that the commission would have no further recommendations at the present as he believed it had covered as much ground as could be taken up by the present congress.

Representative Kinchelo, democrat, Kentucky, asserted it was not "fair" for the commission to make its report and leave Washington. He declared the co-operative marketing recommendations were "vague."

Mr. Merritt said that co-operative would operate with success only if they furnished their own capital.

The majority of the commission, he said, were not in favor of legislation proposing the creation of export corporations for farm products, but held an "open mind" on this subject, which probably would be considered further.

Clear Sailing for Stone.

For a second time the senate judiciary committee today ordered a favorable report on the nomination of Attorney General Stone to be a supreme court justice.

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closed doors after senators had reviewed again the circumstances surrounding the new legal proceeding here against Senator Wheeler of Montana and the objection raised to Mrs. Stone's argument before the supreme court years ago as counsel for the Morgan estate in the Ownbey case.

Administration leaders expect confirmation by the senate without much delay, opponents of the nomination having indicated they see little object in attempting a prolonged fight.

Members of the committee said there was no votes in opposition when the committee acted, but some of the senators withheld their votes.


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CHEER UP! END OF WORLD POSTPONED SEVERAL YEARS

(Associated Press Local Wire.) OAKLAND, Cal., Feb. 2.—The prophecy that the world was coming to an end next Friday as announced by Mrs. Margaret W. Rowen of Los Angeles, "Supreme Prophetess" of the "Reformed" Adventist Church, was amended today by Mrs. Erna Bruick, a member, who said she had had visions of a deluge in the expected millennium. A number of them were reported to have sold their worldly possessions and were using the money to spread the prophecy that the end is near. According to Province the word has been broadcast over the United States, Denmark, England and India.

Next War Horror Predictions Are 'Absurd'—Wilbur

(Associated Press Local Wire.) WASHINGTON, Feb. 2.—Pictures of the "next war" as a process of annihilation of whole communities by poison gases, germs and high explosives are viewed by Secretary Wilbur as "absurd" and not only physically impossible but also probably outside the possibility of human will.

The secretary, in a statement last night, asserted reports that such methods of destruction had been perfected are "not true and not justified by past history or present conditions."

Production and transportation of poison gas in sufficient quantity would be impossible, Mr. Wilbur said, while the case of germs would mean an spread of disease to the forces employing them.

"There is no doubt," the secretary added, "that modern warfare is a serious and frightful thing, as we have been so lately reminded, and that unpreparedness for such war and its possibilities is inexcusable in any nation that has means for preparing to avoid the hideous possibilities of modern warfare."

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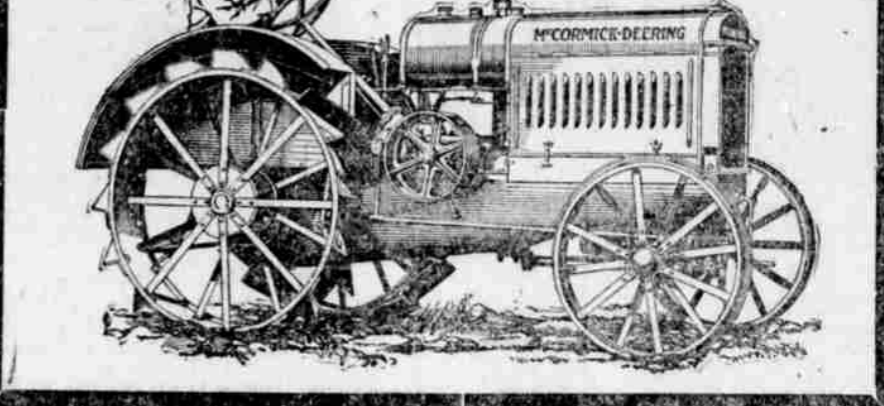
