FINAL COUNT OF ELECTORAL VOTE MADE IN SENATE

Congress Gives Attest to Election of Coolidge and Dawes in November.

VOTES CAST WERE 531

Senator Cummins Presides at Historic Ceremony and Announces Election of Republican Ticket.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, Feb. 11.—The results of the November election received the final attestation of congress today in joint convention assembled. The statement by senator Cummins that the count of the electoral votes showed Calvin Coolidge of Massachusetts and Charles G. Dawes of Illinois to have been elected, and the entering of the ballot in the journal of both houses, closed the political contest in accordance with constitutional requirements.

Barely half an hour was set aside for the ceremony. Pursuant to a concurrent resolution of the joint assembly, the senate marched to the house chamber preceded by the sergeant-at-arms and accompanied by pages carrying the electoral votes in locked boxes. Senator Cummins presided with speaker Gillett on the dais at his left.
