Every person, firm, copartnership, company and corporation owning, leasing, occupying, possessing or having charge of or dominion over any land, place, building, structure, wharf, pier or dock which is infested with ground squirrels, or as soon as the presence of same shall come to his, their or its knowledge at once proceed and continue in good faith to exterminate and destroy such rodents by poisoning, trapping or other appropriate and effective means.

The following poison for the extermination and destruction of such ground squirrels is hereby recommended, to-wit: Strychnine (Alkaloid) used on either barley or wheat, (barley preferred), mixed according to the following formula and manner, to-wit:

Barley, clean grain 18 quarts; Strychnine (Alkaloid) 1 ounce; Bicarbonate of soda (baking soda) 1 ounce; thin starch paste 3-4 pint; Heavy corn syrup 1-4 pint; Glycerine 1 tablespoonful; Saccharine 1-10 ounce.
