PRICE OF FOOD TAKES NEW JUMP

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
WASHINGTON, Feb. 20.—Another boost of two percent in the average retail price of food in the month ending January 15, was reported by the department of labor today on the basis of figures from 51 cities. Thirty five articles of food showed an increase in price, while seven showed a decrease.

Of the 47 cities for which an increase was reported, Houston, with seven percent, showed the greatest advance. Other cities showing relative sharp increases were San Francisco, five percent; Los Angeles and Seattle, four percent; and Butte, Montana; Omaha, Portland, Ore., and Salt Lake City, three percent.

WINTER MANEUVERS OF PLANES ENDED

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
CAMP SKEEL, Oscoda, Mich., Feb. 20.—Officers of the first pursuit group of the United States army air service winged homeward to their Selfridge Field base today, their winter air maneuvers ended, and, according to Major Thomas G. Lanphier, commanding a completely successful maneuver demonstration, Major Lanphier said, that the army service can maintain an effective military campaign under Arctic conditions without any recourse to ground transport of any kind and without the aid of any other branch of the nation's military establishment.

Wm. Brady to HALT 'BAD WOMAN'

NEW YORK, Feb. 20.—In view of wide spread criticism of a dog on Broadway sex plays besides "A Good Bad Woman," which William A. Brady will voluntarily withdraw after tomorrow's performance, District Attorney Banton has come out in favor of censorship by a jury of play goers.

"I want to get away from political censorship and think that the most effective curb on plays will come from within," Mr. Banton said today.

"I have in mind selecting a panel of 300 representative citizens who are also playgoers. From this list the commissioner of police could select 12 to act upon complaints. I think the recommendation of the play jury should be followed, if not we can then prosecute."

Mr. Banton then added that he also would be in favor of applying the jury system to complaints against objectionable books. Discussing his agreement in discussing "A Good Bad Woman" Mr. Brady said today he was "mentally satisfied, but financially disgruntled."

"There is a load off my soul," he asserted, "but I never feel comfortable about giving \$25,000 back."

The \$25,000 was refunded to patrons who bought tickets for the next week. Speculators sold tickets for last night's performance for \$20.

CITY CHURCHES CROWDED TO WELCOME EX-CONVICT

MINNEAPOLIS, Feb. 20.—A man who, as a confessed criminal and an undesirable, left Minneapolis 32 years ago by order of the police, recently returned, a convert to Christianity and a leader in welfare and criminal rehabilitation work. He is John Callahan, superintendent of Hadley Rogers Hall, famous reformatory in the Bowery, New York, and chaplain of the Tombs prison.

Conditions surrounding the man's departure from Minneapolis and his subsequent return, according to Callahan himself, offer a great contrast. Driven from this city in its infancy as a convict, "too crooked to trust him" and as a confessed chief, Callahan on his return found Minneapolis paying homage to him in almost unprecedented manner.

Callahan spent one week here, and was swamped with visits and messages from Minneapolis' leading men and women.

Welcomed by the bench and bar, the pulpit and the home, Callahan had a program of activity which engaged his time on an average of 14 hours daily. He spoke before many of the leading local civic, business and church clubs in addition to innumerable other gatherings. On the only Sunday spent here Callahan visited different churches to speak briefly, and special afternoon services were held to give the parishioners an opportunity to hear him.

"Faith in the Bible," Callahan told his audiences, "made me good and kept me good." He still carries the same little copy of the New Testament with him the night of his conversation.

WOMAN WOULD BE POLITICAL EQUAL

LONDON, Feb. 20.—Advocates of a scheme for making women the political equals of men by granting them the vote at the age of 21, instead of 30, as at present, are having a field day in the House of Commons today but with no prospect of victory.

William Whiteley, laborite, is introducing a bill for the granting of full franchise to women and has the support of the liberals as well as his own party, but the home secretary Sir William Joynson-Hicks, on behalf of the government is moving an amendment which must kill the effort in view of the big ministerial majority in the house.

The amendment calls upon the house to refuse "in the early stages of a new parliament to pass a bill involving general election with consequent interruption of the government's work." But advocates of a scheme of franchise reform and it should be brought before the house at a suitable time at the meeting of the parliament.

The contention that the bill would involve an election is denied by its supporters. Many conservatives favor in principle the suggested extension, which would add some millions to the electorate and make women the dominating power in any election.

HALT BOY THIEVES BY RAIN OF LEAD

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 20.—Three youths in an automobile which police said was stolen, were chased through downtown streets last night and stopped only by a hail of bullets, which wounded two of their number. The stolen machine was wrecked against a street lamp.

In the central emergency hospital they gave their names as James O'Neil, 18, Eldred Brady, 19, and David Cullen, 21. O'Neil was shot in the back and his skull was fractured. He may die. Cullen was shot by glass.

UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE TO MEET ON FRIDAY NIGHT

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Feb. 20.—Special—The university of Oregon, the best school in the Pacific Coast and Northwest basketball conference, and Oregon Agricultural College, which stands in second place, will meet here Friday night in the second of a two-game series. Oregon won the first, at Corvallis, 22 to 13.

Oregon has scored 162 points in five coast conference games to 137 for their opponents, thus averaging 32 points to 27 for the opposition. The Aggies average is only 22 points per game, while their opponents have scored on an average of 19 times a contest. Oregon has a margin of five points a game to three points for the Aggies.

Friday's game will end Oregon's home schedule. Starting Monday, the team will take the road and play four games in six days, facing Whitman, Feb. 23 at Walla Walla; Washington State, Feb. 24 at Pullman; Idaho, Feb. 25 at Moscow; and Washington, Feb. 26 at Seattle.
