EIGHT MEN AND BOYS GO TO PEN

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

MEDFORD, Ore., Feb. 21.—The gates of Oregon penal institutions opened today for eight men and boys sentenced from Jackson county and, while their misdeeds ranged wide in fields of crime, the automobile was a heavy contributing factor in their fall.

The prisoners range from Elmer Howell, a bashful boy of eleven years to Roland Eastwood, 35, a metallurgist, who graduated from the University of Edinburgh, Scotland, and held responsible positions with British mining concerns in many lands.

The others ordered committed to the reform school are Julian Daily, 12; and Fred Reavis, 14, of this city, accused of stealing a car and starting a world tour, reaching Ashland before being captured.

James Mobley, 17 and Charles Simpson, 15 of Seattle, who ran away from their homes and also stole an automobile.

Friday Sheriff Jennings left for the state prison with Roland Eastwood sentenced to 15 years, Steve Eiek, sentenced to ten years and Robert Huff, sentenced to five years for the hold up of the Union Oil station in Ashland. The car in which the trio were traveling was stolen in Los Angeles, according to authorities.

FIREBUG WAS CAUSE OF HUNDRED FIRES

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 21.—Fire Marshal Grenfell, who has been directing investigation of incendiary fires which Chester C. Buchtel, Portland fireman, has confessed starting, declared today he believed that Buchtel had been responsible for nearly 100 fires. Buchtel had confessed 28, most of them small fires, and has refused to admit any connection with several large incendiary fires. Losses from incendiary fires in Portland during the period in which Buchtel operated amount to more than \$100,000, said Grenfell.

Buchtel remained in jail today. His father, A. L. Buchtel, asked of officers that his son be held without bail, declaring he did not consider it safe for him to be released.

Grenfell declared he knew of no parallel case.

"This is the only instance on record where a man within a city department turned firebug and started fires with such heavy losses," he said.

Buchtel continues to declare that he does not know what actuated him in his fire starting activities.

OIL BARGE EXPLODES

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 21.—Three men were killed and four seriously injured today when a Crew-Levick company oil barge exploded while pumping oil into tanks at municipal garbage disposal plant in the extreme Southwestern part of the city. The blast was so terrific that it was heard in the central part of Philadelphia.

The killed and injured were workmen on the barge.

Fire spread to the disposal plant and exploded an oil storage tank causing a loss of \$100,000.

KLAN LEADERS INJURED

ATLANTA, Ga., Feb. 21.—Colonel W. J. Simmons of Atlanta, former imperial wizard of the Ku Klux Klan, and Norria Moore of Houston, Tex., supreme knight recorder of the Knights of the Flaming Sword, which Simmons now heads, were probably fatally injured in an automobile accident last night a few miles from Gainesville, Ga., it was learned here today.

The two men were taken to a hospital at Gainesville and it was reported that Colonel Simmons had suffered a punctured lung and that both collar bones had been broken. Mr. Moore's neck was reported broken.

J. R. Rainer of Atlanta, who is connected with the Knights of the Flaming Sword, escaped injury.

The three men were enroute to Colonel Simmons' home in the Nocochee valley in northern Georgia on an organization trip and in traveling over the highway about 20 miles from Gainesville, the machine struck a soft spot in the road and plunged down an embankment.

WOOD'S SON MISSING.

PARIS, Feb. 21.—The police late today began investigation into the disappearance of Osborn C. Wood, son of Leonard Wood, governor-general of the Philippines, who has been missing since Monday from his hotel.

The inquiry was instituted at the request of his valet.

Mr. Wood's valet ignorant of his master's whereabouts or the reason for his prolonged absence, has been holding his rooms for him on the supposition that he might return at any moment.

Several persons are said to have seen Mr. Wood leave the hotel where he has been living for nearly a year and there has been no idea that he was absent on other than his own volition and for personal reasons.

The military attaché's office of the American embassy also requested the police to begin a search for Wood.

The missing American left his hotel Monday before lunch, it was said, and was reported to have last been seen in a Latin quarter cafe shortly after noon of the same day.

LEGISLATURE ADJOURNS

STATE HOUSE, Salem, Ore., Feb. 21.—Both houses of the legislature will adjourn late this afternoon until 11 o'clock Monday forenoon. Leaders expected that a sine die adjournment would be reached on Wednesday or Thursday of next week. Leaders were planning holding over to dispose of an accumulation of bills, including appropriation measures. After tonight legislators will serve without pay.

CLEANUP KLAMATH FALLS

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Feb. 21.—As the opening gun of a moral cleanup announced this week by Mayor Fred R. Goddard, police and prohibition officers late last night arrested Leslie Conzo, and confiscated more than 50 gallons of liquor.

Conzo, his wife and an alleged employe were held on charges of violating the prohibition law.
