Rules and Regulations, Kiwanis Spelling Contest

Each elementary school in Roseburg shall send three champion spellers from each of its fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades to compete for the championship of the city. The championship oral contest will be held at the high school auditorium on Friday night, April 3, at 7:30 o'clock. The selection of the three best spellers from each elementary grade above named will be left to the teachers of the various grades, who shall conduct elimination contests.

At the championship contest the champion speller of the three in each of the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades of each of the three schools, the Benson, Rose and Fullerton will be awarded \$5 in gold.

The grand prize winner, or champion of the entire contest, will receive a \$50 gold watch, either boys' or girls' to be selected by the winner, and \$5 in gold.

A committee of three Roseburg Rotarians will act as judges for the spelling contest and all questions concerning the spelling of words shall be decided by these three judges.

The sources of words to be used in the championship contest will be from the Buckingham Extension of the Ayres Spelling Scale as printed in The Roseburg News-Review and distributed to the various

grades prior to the contest; and the present textbook, Book 2 of the New World Speller for the fifth and sixth grades and Book 3 for the seventh and eighth grades. A supplementary list will be prepared by the superintendent for use in the event the above list of words is exhausted.

When a word is given out to a contestant he shall be adjudged to have failed unless he immediately pronounces it, spells it correctly at first attempt and if necessary indicates capitals. Permission is given to repeat a letter or letters once, provided no change is made, if a word is not understood by a contestant when it is first pronounced it shall be repeated, defined or used in a sentence before the contestant shall be adjudged to have failed.

City of Reedsport Has Second Largest Payroll in Douglas Co.

Great Program of Building Activity Being Carried Out in Coast City. Timber and Waterways Afford Rich Natural Resources and Give Promise for Future.

The city of Reedsport, a thriving city of about 2500 population, situated on the Port of Umpqua near the mouth of the Umpqua River, which is the largest river between the Columbia and the Golden Gate. Also served by the Coos Bay line of the Southern Pacific System, the railroad company having recently built a new depot in the city.

The present development of the Port of Umpqua includes a government appropriation of \$275,000 now being used under government direction in extending the present north jetty. The Port owns a new section dredge which has been busy all summer removing shoals in the inner channel.

The advantage of being where rail and water meet, make it possible to get the best of transportation service. The present water shipments are largely lumber to California. Reedsport is on the newly completed Roosevelt Highway, and the Umpqua Highway which is completed with the exception of a few miles of surfacing. There is a great deal of building activity at present, in the way of stores, apartment buildings and residential plans are under way that will mature at an early date.

FIRST CARLOAD BROCCOLI SENT OUT OF RIDDLE

Umpqua Broccoli Exchange loads Out First Car of the Season.

MARKET IS UNSTEADY

Prices Vary, Being Governed Largely by Quality of the Broccoli Shipped.

The first carload of broccoli is being shipped out of the county by the Umpqua Broccoli Exchange and according to Foster Butler will be marketed in the Northwest. Mr. Butler states that his company expects to handle about fifteen or twenty carloads out of the Ripley and Myrtle Creek district during the season. For the next two weeks there will probably be one carload every two days. There will then probably be a short gap between the early and late crops after which there will be a carload shipped

daily. At the present time, Mr. Butler says, the market is very unsettled, and broccoli is bringing prices ranging from \$1.00 to \$1.75 per crate, depending largely upon the quality. The market is being borne down greatly by California cauliflower, which is being sold now at 40 cents per crate for twelve or larger.

The local market is paying from 75 cents to \$1.00. Indications are that the bulk of the crop will be produced in the Riddle and Myrtle Creek section, where there was much less damage done by the cold weather than in the northern half. The broccoli growers in the northern part of the county and around Roseburg, are harvesting a few crates, most of which are being placed on the local market. A few crates have been sent to Portland by express, but there will probably not be more than two or three carloads at most out of this city.

The canneries are expected to take some of the crop and is now arranging for a short run on broccoli. Manager Geddes announced this morning, that he is getting everything in readiness, and expects within the next few days to start canner operations. This will create an opening for the disposal of the heads of good quality, but poorly formed, of which there are a good number, and will give the growers an opportunity to realize something on their crop.

CONTRACT FOR HOPS

EUGENE, Ore., Feb. 26.—Contracts for 50,000 pounds of Lane county hops at 17 cents per pound have been closed between the John Seaver hop island ranch east of here to Rhoads and Jackson of London, England. The hops are to be delivered on the cars at Springfield, between October 1, 1925 and December 1, 1925.

The order is the largest for hops in Lane county for some time, and is one of the first of the large contracts on the present year's crop.
