"ENOCH ARDEN" DIVORCE IS DECLARED LEGAL

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

NEW YORK, Mar. 6.—Supreme Court Justice Dike of Brooklyn, who on Wednesday granted Mrs. Evelyn Naegele Parker an "Enoch Arden" decree of divorce from Dr. Herschel C. Parker, explorer and former Columbia University professor said today that the presence of Dr. Parker in Portland, Oregon, would not affect the decree.

Justice Dike said he believed Mrs. Parker could have the decree set aside if she wished, but that Dr. Parker could take no such action.

"His wife and two children are in need of his support," said Justice Dike, "and I hope that some way may be found to get it for them."

Mrs. Parker's lawyer said that she would not seek to have the decree annulled.

"But if this is Professor Parker," added the attorney, "I will seek to have him indicted for abandonment. Five years ago he was ordered by the court to pay his wife \$100 a week separation allowance. He has not paid one cent. He is in arrears about \$25,000."

A divorce may be obtained in New York when one of the parties has been missing five years.

PORTLAND, Ore., March 6.—Dr. Herschel C. Parker, who was informed today that efforts would be made in New York to force him to return to that state to support his two daughters declared he was without funds, and he would not take seriously the assertion of Justice Dike of Brooklyn that his wife, Mrs. Evelyn Naegele Parker, who obtained an "Enoch Arden" divorce decree was in need.

"She is earning a large income as a commercial artist," he told The Associated Press, "and I had been informed that she had even enough money for a trip to New York. I have been engaged in experimental work, and my means are limited."

Dr. Parker declared, he was the aggrieved one in the marital difficulty. He said that as a mining engineer his duties called him to Alaska some years ago, and his wife refused to accompany him. This, he declared, constituted abandonment. He said he had decided her all his property in New York before he left that state.

He said he had no immediate intention of returning to New York, and that his plans for the future depended upon the persons for whom he is working in his mining experiments.

He expressed the hope that he would be able to win large returns from his work, and that he wants to provide liberally for his daughters, when he has obtained the means.
