TIMBERMAN IS KILLED BY TREE

Broken Limb Tears Off Side of Man's Head as Tree Hits Obstruction.

SISTERS AT CAMP

Dr. Wade of This City Is Called to Scene of Accident but Was Unable to Give Help.

Wesley Carlyle, well known timberman, was instantly killed yesterday morning at about 9 o'clock at Bridge, in Coos county, when a limb from a falling tree hit the back of his head. Mr. Carlyle was employed by E. E. Westly and Sons, at their logging camp at Bridge at the time of the accident. He and a fellow worker, Fred Boren, were felling some timber at the camp and had just cut a large tree, when it fell against some smaller timber nearby, the obstruction causing one of the large limbs to snap off and hit Mr. Carlyle in the back of the head, tearing off part of the right side of the skull, and crushing and mangling it badly. He was taken from the mass of timber to a bunk house near by, and Dr. Charles B. Wade, of this city, was immediately summoned to the scene of the accident in the hope that the man could be revived. However it was found he was beyond help, and Dr. Phil Keyser, coroner of Coos

county was called to Bridge to hold an inquest.

Mr. Carlyle was single, and had been living on a homestead near Coquille. He was 25 years of age, and was well known in Coos county, having worked as a logger for the past ten years. Surviving are two sisters, who were working at the cook house near by, at which he boarded, two sisters at Cottage Grove, and one brother at Myrtle Point. He was a man of excellent character, and made many friends in Coos county where he lived. The funeral arrangements have not been made as yet.

EVERLEIGH GIRLS PICK OF COUNTRY SAYS THE MISTRESS.

CHICAGO, March 6.—The girls of the Everleigh Club, the notorious underworld resort, the making of which has been made in the conspiracy trial of the wealthy W. E. D. Stokes of New York, married into the richest families in the country, according to Stokes' informants.

Pride in her youthful aristocracy of the underworld was evidenced by Minnie Everleigh, as Stokes, in his testimony yesterday, said he found her living under the name of Miss Lester in Seventy-First Street, New York, when he interviewed her in an effort to trace a red haired girl, Helen Underwood, who had been an inmate of the resort.

He is being tried for conspiracy to defame his estranged wife, Helen Elwood Stokes of Denver. The girls were the pick of the country," he said Minnie Everleigh told him as she stood erect, refusing to open the book at the past. "Some of them married into some of the richest families in the United States. Our life in Chicago is a closed book. We'll give you no information."

"All right, Madam," Stokes said he replied. "I admire you for your loyalty."

SHERIFF ARRESTS MAN IN PORTLAND

Lon Tellock, ex-fish commission employe, who served as a sea lion hunter for the state, was arrested yesterday by Portland officers, at the request of Sheriff Sam Starmer, who, with District Attorney Gordon, has been spending several days in Portland on official business. According to word received from Portland the specific charge against him is that he "induced a woman, one Agnes Gatens, into a life of white slavery." The charge is brought under an Oregon law which is modeled after the national white slave act.

Tellock denied the charge and said that politics was behind it. He told the police that he did not run away with Mrs. Gatens and that he knew nothing of her whereabouts.

Sheriff Starmer knows little of the case. He received a warrant for Tellock's arrest, issued by the office of the Peach Eason of Roseburg, and signed by Frank Gatens, husband of the woman, in which Tellock was accused of inducing the woman to leave her husband and travel about the state.

"This whole thing is a mystery to me," Tellock declared following his arrest at Portland. "I have known Frank Gatens since I was a boy. I knew Mrs. Gatens, but I swear that I did not run off with her. The whole affair looks like politics to me. The policeman who arrested me know nothing of the charge against me. The sheriff doesn't know anything about it. I can't figure it out."

GETS THREE YEARS.

BEND, Ore., March 6.—Harold B. Marsh, who was yesterday found guilty of arson by a jury in circuit court, was sentenced to three years in the penitentiary by Judge T. E. J. Duffy, who immediately paroled the prisoner pending good behavior.

Marsh who is said to be attending college now, was charged with having set fire to his ranch buildings at Deschutes in October 1923 for the purpose of defrauding the insurers.
