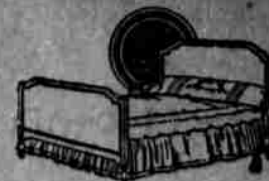
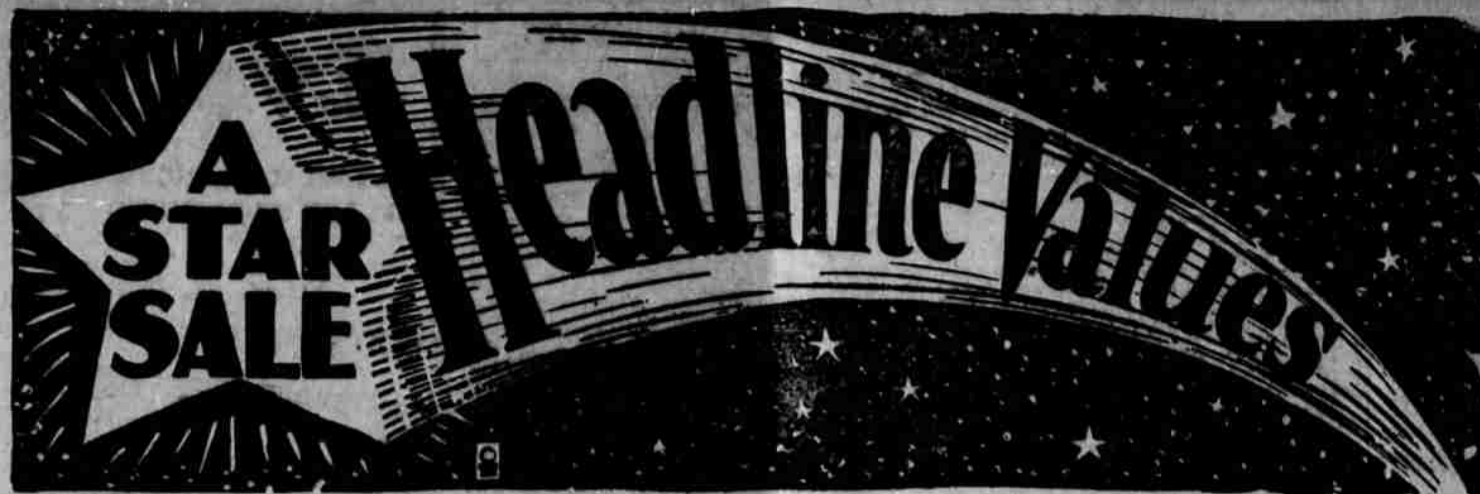

**CONGRESS SCORED FOR ITS NEGLECT OF DISABLED VETS**

WASHINGTON, Mar. 9.—Failure of congress to enact legislation establishing a medical corps in the veterans bureau and its action in fixing June 30 as the limit of time within which disabled veterans may enter vocational training "is a repudiation of the nation's protection to its defenders," declared a statement issued today by Frank J. Irwin, national commander of the disabled veterans. The statement said "further weakening of the unsatisfactory medical division is inevitable" as a result of the failure of the bill passed by the house.
