OREGON-AGGIES IN CRUCIAL GAME AT SALEM TONIGHT

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

EUGENE, Ore., Mar. 9.—University of Oregon and Oregon Agricultural College basketball teams will meet tonight at Salem, in the third and deciding game of a three-game series to decide the championship of the northern section of the Pacific Coast intercollegiate conference. The winner of the game tonight will play the University of California tonight for the coast championship.

By defeating the Aggies at Corvallis Saturday night, 23, to 21, the Oregon team led the series, and made the play-off necessary. If the Aggies win tonight, they will meet California at Corvallis on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Should Oregon win, California will be met here Thursday afternoon in Portland Friday and at Corvallis Saturday night.

Fourteen Oregon players are to be taken to Salem this morning. They are Johnson and Gowan, forward; Oberberg, center; Westerman and Jost, guards; Reinhart, Stoddard, Carter, Hughes, Anderson, Gillenwaters, Bewell, Chiles and Gunther, spares.

A special train is to be run to the capital city to accommodate the crowd of rooters who plan to witness the crucial game of the season.

SALEM, Ore., Mar. 9.—Over a thousand people had refused tickets to tonight's Oregon-O. A. C. basketball clash by 11 o'clock today. The Willamette gymnasium, where the game is to be played, has a capacity of 1500.

PEDESTRIANS GIVEN RIGHT OF WAY OVER LOS ANGELES AUTOS

LOS ANGELES, Mar. 7.—(A. P.)—The new traffic ordinance recently made effective here gives pedestrians the right of way over motorists outside of the central traffic zone. One about desiring to cross a street at any intersection not under police control is supposed to signal his desire by holding up his hand to approaching motorists, whom the law obliges to stop until the crosswalk is clear.

CAPITALIST AND LABORER NEARING END OF LONG WAR

NEW YORK, Mar. 9.—The United States is experiencing a redistribution of property ownership upon a scale which promises to end the struggle of capital versus labor, in the opinion of Thomas N. Carver, professor of political economy at Harvard, as expressed in a speech prepared for delivery today before the academy of political science. The four chief phases of the movement were outlined in the paper as follows:

The increase of savings deposits; the growth of industrial insurance; the rapid increase in the number of employees and customers who are becoming shareholders in corporations; the rapid development of labor banks.

WEEK-END AUTO ACCIDENTS TAKE LIVES OF THREE

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

SEATTLE, Wash., Mar. 9.—Three deaths were the week-end toll from traffic accidents in Seattle. Charles G. Burns, 28, died in a hospital here as the result of a collision between two automobiles.

Captain J. H. Camm, living at Des Moines, south of Seattle, was knocked down and killed almost instantly in front of his home while helping to push a stalled automobile into the driveway.

Jean Smith, aged seven years, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Smith of Hunts Point, was knocked down by a speeding car Saturday night, receiving injuries from which he died yesterday. Victor Swanson, 28, of La Colina was arrested in that city last night and brought to Seattle for investigation in connection with the accident.

According to witnesses of the accident, the car that struck the girl stopped some distance away, two men leaped out, saw that the child was being picked up, and then drove away.

Swanson, according to the police, admits having been the driver of the car. He and his companions thought when they saw the girl being picked up that her injuries were not serious and drove on, Swanson said.

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The pedestrians, however, are held rigorously to rules in that they are prohibited from crossing streets anywhere except at corners. "Jaywalkers" are liable to arrest in the downtown congested districts if the foot traffic is required to follow the police signals and move with vehicles.

Violators of the ordinance, including "jaywalkers," are subject to a fine of \$50 and a jail sentence for the first offense; a \$100 fine and ten days' confinement for a second violation, and for the third transgression a fine of \$500 and a six months' jail sentence.
