HOMESTEADER IS FOUND IN CABIN ILL WITH PNEUMONIA

Charles Irwin, aged 55 years, a homesteader on Honey creek, was found yesterday afternoon in his cabin suffering from a severe case of pneumonia. He had been there for a week alone, apparently unconscious much of the time. He was in a terribly weakened condition but it is believed that he will recover.

Irwin went in to his homestead about 7 miles up Honey creek, a week ago Tuesday, telling his neighbors that he would return in one week. He was going in to visit his line of traps and do necessary work at the cabin.

When he failed to appear, one of his friends went in search of him, and yesterday morning found him in bed very ill.

He became drenched on the trail going in to his cabin and became chilled. He took a severe cold, and it immediately went into pneumonia. Apparently he was without food or fire for three or four days and was unconscious as he had lost all track of time. He had prepared a poultice and placed it on his chest, which undoubtedly saved his life.

Dr. Belt, the county physician was called yesterday, and was required to make the trip in from Rock Creek on horseback, returning home at 1 a. m. today. He gave Mr. Irwin such remedies as were needed to benefit his condition, but it appears that the crisis has passed and that the man will now recover. Supplies are being packed in today, and Irwin will have company until he recovers sufficiently to care for himself.

FIND MORE MONEY HIDDEN BY KORETZ

CHICAGO, March 12.—A hitherto unrevealed asset of Leo Koretz, promoter of a Panama oil scheme, who recently died in Joliet prison, amounts to \$15,000 or more, it was reported today, although government authorities have declined to name the exact amount. The cache was said to have been located in a safety deposit box in a Chicago bank.

KU KLUX KLAN ALLEGED PLANS BARED IN LETTER

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) HOUSTON, Tex., March 12.—Voluminous correspondence exchanged by officials of the Ku Klux Klan was introduced in evidence yesterday in the cross action suit brought by George B. Kimbro, former Grand Goblin against the order, asking \$500,000 damages for alleged defamation of his character.

Plan of the Klan to control the government of the United States through a Washington bureau was detailed in one piece of correspondence signed by an imperial officer and sent to all King Klans.

The Washington bureau, according to the letter, was in charge of "Grand Goblin Terrell," and all King Klans were ordered to write Terrell in regard to eligibility of their respective congressmen and senators as members of the Klan. Terrell's duty was to "naturalize" these representatives and senators, according to the letter. "When Klansmen can say that Senator so-and-so is a member of the organization, it will increase the respect for the order," the document read.

The letter went on to say that since the republican had gotten in power at Washington employees at the capitol were clamoring to get in the "order" to hold their jobs, and that Catholics were "going so far as to discard their Knights of Columbus pins."

FAMOUS SPY MISSING.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) NEW YORK, March 12.—The New York American says today that it has learned that Dr. Arringard Karl Graves, whose exploits as an international spy had won him world wide fame, has been missing since last August, when he took a trip to St. Louis to gather information concerning an alleged plot to restore the Hohenzollerns to the throne of Germany.

The American says that friends of Dr. Graves have placed the case in the hands of a private detective agency, which has reason to suspect that he may have met with foul play. Investigation by this agency, the American says, revealed that Dr. Graves had discovered a plot to stage a royalist coup in Germany on March 1st, and to place the Crown Prince on the throne.
