TWENTY-TWO CARS BROCCOLI SHIPPED

Twenty-two carloads of broccoli have been shipped out of the county up to the present time. One of these was shipped from Roseburg, three from Myrtle Creek, and eighteen from Riddle. It is anticipated that there will be about fifteen more cars before the season ends, as there appears to be considerable late broccoli coming on. The bulk of the crop has been sold on the Pacific coast market, although some cars have gone to Chicago for distribution to middle western points. The market is steady, ranging from 75 cents to \$1.60 depending upon quality. Good broccoli brings a fair price, owing to the fact that much of the California cauliflower this year was of poor quality. MAN WHO WAS BEING SOUGHT, DEAD

COUNCIL BLUFFS, Ia., March 12.—The body of E. A. Wickham, 25, war time contractor and financier of Council Bluffs, for two days the object of an almost nation-wide search was found late last night hanging by a rope fastened to the ceiling of an unused basement room in his home here, by Leo Wickham, a brother and police captain J. C. Shafer.

Apparently Mr. Wickham has been dead since he returned from a walk Monday noon, the last time he was seen alive, but his disappearance was not discovered until he failed to answer a call to dinner that evening. Immediately the alarm was sent out and a search, in which the officers of Iowa, Nebraska and Illinois were asked to participate was instituted.

The palatial home of the wealthy contractor was thoroughly searched, but no attempt was made to gain entrance to the room where the body was found, and which was locked, until last night.
