(Continued from page 1) something was wrong. Falman added to the details of the story he told yesterday after an all night questioning, that Shepherd had taken a course at his school and that shortly afterwards three tubes of bacilli, one of them containing typhoid germs, had disappeared.

When Shepherd came for the letter, Falman said, "I at once accused him of taking away my test tubes of typhoid germs. He just laughed and said: 'I'll take care of you well later on.' I never thought any more about the incident until the newspapers told of the inquiry into McClintock's death. In conversation he said he had with Shepherd, Falman said, "Shepherd wanted to know whether the germs could be introduced into a person's system by hypodermic inoculation. I told him germs mixed with a person's food were likely to have more effect, because conditions in food were better for their culture."

When Shepherd was brought before him Dr. Falman immediately identified him as the man who had made the inquiries regarding the germs and accused by Falman of having taken the three tubes of bacilli. Falman asserted positively in Shepherd's presence that he was the same man who had paid \$50 for the letter of inquiry sent to the supreme court.

"You know you did," Falman said to Shepherd. "I never saw the gentleman before two weeks ago," said Shepherd, appealing to assistant state attorneys present.

"He was the fellow all right," Falman reiterated. "You're a liar," Shepherd retorted.

Attorney Robert Stoll, partner of Shepherd, was at the Shepherd home when the state's attorneys and detectives arrived. He said they were "expecting something of the kind" and would not be surprised if charges would be placed against Shepherd.
