While awaiting more complete and authentic advice concerning the disarmament situation abroad, President Coolidge believes recent developments there as already indicated have opened the way to a more definite approach to the project of another arms limitation conference to be entered by the United States in Geneva, concerning the league of nations disarmament and security protocol, the president proposes to give close

attention to the matter in conference with Secretary Kellogg. Any step approaching a formal presentation of the conference idea to the nations interested, however, will await a survey of the situation on the basis of more authentic advice to be received through official channels. As yet there has been no actual approach to any of the committees on the subject and the conference planned by the president and his secretary of state will in fact be the initial move in getting the many preliminaries attending
