CHICAGO, March 4.—Two trainloads of golfers armed with iron headed clubs and thousands of miles of 1.5 inch diameter links are to invade Canada in August with the intention of playing most of the courses in the northwest.

The golfers will have its four horsemen in the persons of Chick Evans, former national champion, Captain E. P. Carter, once Irish title-holder, and two famous professionals. This quartette will lead the charge on the various links, while 500 other leaders will furnish living quarters during the incursion of the Canadian northwest. The golf army is recruiting from cities around the Great Lakes. WARSHIPS IDLE AS OFFICERS GO INTO SKULL PRACTICE

SAN DIEGO, March 14.—Fourteen admirals and 400 officers of staff and command in the United States navy today in assembly at North Island air station, across San Diego bay, engaged in the analysis of the naval battle off the lower California coast, a maneuver participated in during the past two weeks by 162 warcraft of the navy.

The meeting, in the auditorium of the naval air station, is amidst surroundings of an inspiring nature. North Island is a narrow sand spit or peninsula around one side of which is Coronado roads, and on the other San Diego Bay. Stretched in this sea-lane of water, rides the wall fighting strength of America's sea power. There are dreadnaughts, cruisers, destroyers, submarines, aircraft carriers, mine layers, mine sweepers and auxiliary craft of all kinds, some 114 of them. Farther down in the bay rest scores of destroyers out of commission, 79 of them.

Immediately surrounding the meeting place is a spectacular show of aerial strength, the air forces of the naval air station and the air forces of the army, Rockwell Field.

Admiral Robert E. Coontz, commander in chief of the United States fleet, is presiding officer of the session. Officially it is termed a critique. Discussions will be confidential and secret, involving as they do basic matters of the naval defense of the nation. A complete exposition will entail the moves, decisions and results of each fleet, the blue defending fleet of scout cruisers, destroyers and submarines the leader of which achieved fame in their work for the black invading fleet, composed of main battle forces and the convoy.

Vice Admiral Joseph S. McKean presents the record of the search and attack. Admiral S. S. Robinson of the battle fleet, presents the official story of the invasion and defense against attack.
