**WIFE DISAPPEARS
AFTER SICK MATE
BOARDS PULLMAN**

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., March 11.—Police of three cities today sought a 27-year-old Minneapolis woman who ten days ago helped her sick husband into a berth aboard a Pullman enroute to Chicago, kissed him good night and said:

"I'll be back in just a minute," and disappeared, leaving no trace of her whereabouts.

From Chicago by way of Eau Claire, Wis., H. B. Cunningham came here to ask police to help trace the woman. Mrs. Harry Fleck, whose husband is seriously ill in Chicago.

Eau Claire police found that the woman dropped from the Chicago train there March 7, at two a. m., but were unable to determine where she went after that. A train passed through Eau Claire at 2 a. m., bound for Minneapolis and police sought to question its crew for possible clues. Fleck, 22 years old, had just taken a position in Chicago and was on his way to begin work when Mrs. Fleck disappeared. Little could be learned of the Fleck's here today. Inquiries failed to reveal their former residence and Cunningham could not be located.

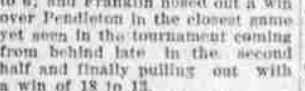

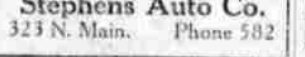
