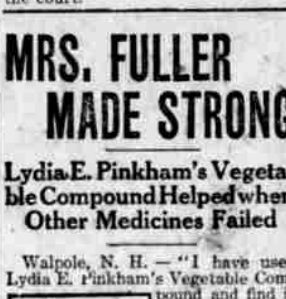

The juvenile court proposes to put the children out for adoption, claiming that the mother is unable to provide for them properly and a hearing is to be held to determine what should be done. Mrs. Palmer was not able to attend the hearing scheduled for today, and no a hearing was provided which will give her time to present her side of the case, and if possible make some arrangements for the care of the children.

WILL GIVE PRIZE FOR BEST POSTER

The dates from April 27 to May 3 have been set aside as American Forest week and during that period an attempt will be made to arouse an interest in the conservation of the timber wealth of the nation, particularly by prevention of fire.

The Umpqua National forest is offering prizes to the grade schools which submit posters best portraying the idea of forest growth, protection and utilization, the first second and third prizes being first, second and third choices of three framed photographs and the fourth, fifth and sixth prizes will be first, second and third choice of similar unframed pictures.

These pictures will be valuable for any school room and it is expected that competition will be keen for them. The posters are to portray any one of the purposes for which the forests were created, it being proper to express the idea by use of drawings, paintings, cartoons, clippings of use of prose or verse.

VANCOUVER CELEBRATES FOUNDING

VANCOUVER, Wash., March 19.—This city is celebrating today the one hundredth anniversary of the founding of Fort Vancouver, which in the early part of the last century was the headquarters of the Hudson Bay company in the "Oregon country" — all that vast territory between the Rocky mountains on the east and the Pacific ocean on the west and between California on the south and the Russian colony in Alaska on the north.

Ground will be broken this afternoon for the construction of a stockade to reproduce the old fort, which was the headquarters of civilization in the Pacific Northwest in the days before the immigration of the 40's.

The old fort will form the center of the 1925 centennial celebration, which is planned to be held here. Charles H. French, manager of the fur trade district of British Columbia for the Hudson Bay company, is to take part in the ground breaking ceremonies this afternoon.

A parade will be part of the ceremonies, and tonight there will be a banquet, at which Governor Roland H. Hartley, of Washington, Governor Walter M. Pierce of Oregon, and other leading officials and citizens of the Pacific Northwest will be present.

PITTSBURGH TEAM HAS NEW PLAYERS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) PASO ROBLES, Cal., Mar. 19.—The Pittsburgh club of 1925 with two new faces in the infield will be a better team than the Pirates of last year's season, said Manager W. B. Keckie today in discussing the outlook for his team.

"No other club in the league possesses an equal amount of speed," he asserted, "and according to the average of the various players, it should, as a unit, hit well over the .300 mark. Headed by Max Carey, who over a long course of years has been leading base stealer and one of the smartest outfielders of the league, its lineup contains such new men as Bigbee, Moore, Grantham, Niehaus and Wright.

Several important cogs in the machine last season, thrown off their stride by illness have been reported in better physical condition this year. This is especially true of third baseman Traynor, who slumped so noticeably last season that he had to be taken out of the lineup for a time. Bigbee at present gives no sign of the trouble which dimmed his batting eye over the past two years.

Last winter's trade with the Cubs which brought Grantham, Aldridge and Niehaus to Pittsburgh in exchange for Maranville, Grizum and Cooper, will benefit the club. Eddie Moore, one of the finds of last year, will supplant Maranville. He is faster, will hit better and can be depended upon in a pinch. Aldridge will win as many games for Pittsburgh as Cooper will for Chicago.

HOSTILE SESSION CONGRESS ENDED

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, Mar. 19.—Memorable for its breach with the White House over the Warren nomination the special session of the senate which convened March 1, had passed into history today after pursuing its turbulent way to the very closing hours. With the senate's adjournment sine die yesterday congress has closed its doors until the convening of the regular session on the first Monday in December unless called in special session, of this President Coolidge has indicated no indication.

The senate finished off the record of its session yesterday by again standing on its opinion with respect to a presidential nomination, refusing to give its approval to the resubmitted nomination of Thomas F. Woodlock of New York to be a member of the Interstate Commerce Commission. The president is expected to give Mr. Woodlock a recess appointment.

In addition to organization of the new senate by which the La Follette insurgents were removed from their places of seniority on standing committees the actual record of achievement for the 12 legislative days of the session was confined to ratification of the Isle of Pines treaty and adoption of two investigation resolutions and a few lesser measures. Agreement also was reached to take up the world court issue next December.
